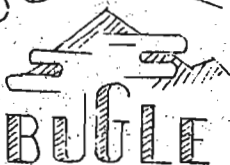

## LOST AND FOUND

THE FIGHTING HAD BEEN HARD AND FURIOUS IN THE RUGGED MOUNTAINOUS TERRAIN OF THE EAST CENTRAL FRONT. THE WEARY "BUFFALOES" OF KING COMPANY HAD STOPPED FOR A BREATHER AFTER SETTING UP A DEFENSE ON NEWLY WON GROUND.

CPL FRED H. MULLIGAN, A MEDIC ASSIGNED TO THE FOURTH PLATOON REMOVED HIS FALSE TEETH AND WAS PREPARING TO REFRESH HIS MOUTH. FINDING THERE WAS A DEFINITE SHORTAGE OF WATER, MULLIGAN PLACED THE TEETH IN HIS PACK TO KEEP THEM FROM BEING LOST OR BROKEN.

CPL MULLIGAN, WITH SEVERAL MEMBERS OF KING COMPANY, SEARCHED FOR WOUNDED OVER THE BLOODY BATTLEGROUND. MULLIGAN CAME UPON A WOUNDED CHINESE SOLDIER AND BEGAN TO SEARCH HIM FOR CONCEALED WEAPONS. RUMMAGING THROUGH HIS PRISONER'S POCKETS HE DISCOVERED A SET OF AMERICAN-MADE FALSE TEETH, SOON TO FIND THEY WERE HIS OWN.

THE "BUFFALOES" SCORED A SECOND VICTORY THAT LONG BITTER NIGHT. MULLIGAN WAS ABLE TO EAT AGAIN.

## COMMUNISTS REJECT LATEST UN PROPOSAL

THERE WERE NO OTHER REPORTS FROM THE TRUCE TALKS, HOWEVER, THE NEGOTIATIONS WILL MEET AGAIN TODAY.

## NEWS BITS

SELECTIVE SERVICE DIRECTOR, LEWIS HERSCHEY, SAYS ABOUT 430,000 MEN WILL BE DRAFTED IN THE PERIOD BETWEEN LAST DECEMBER 1 AND JUNE 30, 1952. HE TOLD THE HOUSE ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEE THAT THIS WOULD STILL LEAVE A POOL OF NINE HUNDRED THOUSAND FROM WHICH MEN COULD BE TAKEN FOR A UNIVERSAL MILITARY TRAINING PROGRAM.

HE SAID THAT A UMT PROPOSAL IS A MUST, AND THAT THE SOONER WE HAVE IT, THE BETTER. THE SOONER UMT IS PUT INTO EFFECT, HERSCHEY SAID, "THE SOONER WE CAN AFFORD TO REDUCE THE SIZE OF THE STANDING ARMED FORCES."

PRIME MINISTER WINSTON CHURCHILL'S CONSERVATIVE PARTY WON A VOTE OF CONFIDENCE YESTERDAY ON HIS NEW AUSTERITY PROGRAM. THE VOTE APPROVED HIS PLAN FOR DOLLAR SHORT BRITAIN TO BUY LESS AND SELL MORE ABROAD.

JOHN M. ALLISON WAS CONFIRMED YESTERDAY BY THE SENATE AS ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE FAR EAST. HE SUCCEEDS DEAN RUSK WHO HAS RESIGNED.
