TOP LEVEL ITEM 5 TALKS

TOP ALLIED AND COMMUNIST NEGOTIATORS MET IN PANMUNJOM YESTERDAY MORNING TO DISCUSS THE FIFTH AND LAST ITEM ON THE AGENDA, RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENTS CONCERNED. IT GOT UNDERWAY AT 1000 AND ADJOURNED LESS THAN AN HOUR LATER.

THERE IS NO REPORT AS YET FROM THAT MEETING.

A SENIOR RED DELEGATE WAS EXPECTED TO LAY BEFORE THE UN DELEGATES A DRAFT OF THE COMMUNIST RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENTS CONCERNED FOR THE SETTLEMENT OF THE KOREAN PROBLEM.

DELEGATES HAVE AGREED ON HAVING 10 JOINT MILITARY OBSERVER TEAMS. THE UN WANTED 15; THE REDS FIVE.

DEFENSE SECRETARY LOVETT YESTERDAY REVEALED NEW TOP SECRET RADAR EQUIPMENT, WHICH HE SAID PERMITS AMERICAN PLANES TO BOMB FROM GREATER SPEEDS, FROM HIGHER ALTITUDES, AND WITH GREATER ACCURACY THAN EVER BEFORE.

THE NEW EQUIPMENT REPLACES THE FAMED NORDEN BOMBSIGHT OF WORLD WAR II.....

THE HOUSE ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEE HAS VOTED TO BAN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AT ALL CAMPS USED BY MEN RECEIVING UNIVERSAL MILITARY TRAINING. ONE REPRESENTATIVE SAYS THE BAN EVEN COVERS 4.2 BEER.....

BRITISH AUTHORITIES EASED RESTRICTIONS YESTERDAY ON THE SUZ CANAL ZONE. THE ARMY HALTED SEARCHING OF EGYPTIAN CIVILIANS ENTERING THE CANAL ZONE AND EASED THE BAN ON THE MOVEMENT OF OIL TRUCKS FROM THE ZONE TO CAIRO.
