THE DEFENSE DEPARTMENT PREDICTS THE HOUSING PROGRAM FOR SERVICE FAMILIES IN THE STATES WILL BE ROLLING IN HIGH THIS SUMMER. SEVEN JAPANESE COMMUNISTS SUSPECTED OF SPYING ON US MILITARY INSTALLATIONS IN JAPAN ARE TO GO ON TRIAL MONDAY BEFORE AN AMERICAN MILITARY COURT. CIVIL POLICE CAUGHT THE SEVEN LAST DECEMBER WHILE THEY WERE HOLDING A SECRET CONFERENCE ON THE OUTSKIRTS OF TOKYO.

COACH ADOLPH RUPP OF KENTUCKY'S CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM YESTERDAY FILED A \$250,000 LIBEL SUIT IN FEDERAL DISTRICT COURT AGAINST THE PUBLISHER OF "LOOK" MAGAZINE. IT ASKED \$100,000 DAMAGES FOR ALLEGED INJURY TO RUPP'S REPUTATION AS A COACH AND A SUCCESSFUL BUSINESSMAN. IT DEMANDED \$130,000 AS PUNITIVE DAMAGES ON THE CLAIM THAT LOOK FAILED TO PUBLISH A RETRACTION AS REQUESTED BY RUPP.

THE SUIT SAID THE LIBEL ACTION WAS BASED ON AN ARTICLE APPEARING IN THE JANUARY 29 ISSUE OF "LOOK," WRITTEN BY KEN COHANE, "LOOK" SPORTS EDITOR.

WORLD NEWS

THE BRITISH HAVE RELAXED SOME OF THEIR RESTRICTIONS IN THE SUEZ CANAL ZONE ON TRAIN TRAFFIC.

SOME EGYPTIAN MILITARY TRAINS AND CIVILIAN SUPPLY TRAINS WILL BE ALLOWED TO MOVE THROUGH THE ZONE, HOWEVER, CIVILIAN PASSENGER TRAINS ARE STILL BANNED.

THERE'S NO OFFICIAL COMMENT IN CAIRO ON REPORTS THAT NEGOTIATIONS WILL BEGIN THIS WEEK BETWEEN BRITISH AND EGYPTIAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TO SEEK SETTLEMENT OF THE LONG DISPUTE OVER THE SUEZ CANAL ZONE AND THE SUDAN.

SETTLEMENT HAS BEEN REACHED IN THE 78-DAY-OLD STRIKE OF PRUDENTIAL COMPANY INSURANCE AGENTS. FEDERAL MEDIATION OFFICIALS ANNOUNCED AGREEMENT ON ALL ISSUES YESTERDAY MORNING AND UNION RATIFICATION IS EXPECTED THIS WEEK.
