



CIB For "Recoil"

THIS MEMBER OF "BAKER" COMPANY IS NOT HELD IN THE TABLE OF ORGANIZATION, BUT NEVERTHELESS "RECOIL" HAS BEEN PUT IN FOR THE CIB.

CALLING "BAKER" COMPANY THEY LEARNED HE WALKED TO THE COMPANY WITH THE SPLINTS ON HIS LEG. "RECOIL" HAS NEVER BEEN SEPARATED FROM THE "BUFFALOES" SINCE.

IN RECENT ACTIONS IN THE HEARTBREAK RIDGE AREA THE FAITHFUL PUP WAS CONSTANTLY AT HIS MASTER'S SIDE. HE WOULD LEAVE ONLY TO GO DOWN THE STEEP HILL TO THE COMPANY MESS HALL FOR CHOW AND RETURNED AFTER EACH MEAL. PRISONER PROBLEM DOMINATES TALKS

THE UNQ YESTERDAY HANDED THE COMMUNISTS A COMPLETE ACCOUNTING OF 44,000 RECLASSIFIED KOREAN WAR PRISONERS, THOUSANDS OF WHOM PRECIPITATED LAST WEEK'S BLOODY PRISON CAMP RIOT.

THE REDS INDICATED THAT THEY WOULD USE THE RIOT AS ARGUMENT AGAINST THE ALLIED PRINCIPLE OF VOLUNTARY REPATRIATION OF WAR PRISONERS.

ACCORDING TO THE REVISED FIGURES, 75 INTERNEES WERE KILLED, AND 139 WOUNDED MONDAY, WHEN 5,000 COMMUNIST SOUTH KOREAN CONVERTS ATTACK AN AMERICAN SECURITY BATTALION TRYING TO SCREEN THEM. ONE AMERICAN WAS KILLED, ONE SERIOUSLY WOUNDED AND 39 TREATED FOR INJURIES.

THE REDS HANDED A PROTEST OF THE INCIDENT TO THE NEGOTIATORS. THE PROTEST HAS BEEN FORWARDED TO GENERAL RIDGWAY'S HEADQUARTERS.

STAFF OFFICERS MET AS USUAL AT 1100 YESTERDAY MORNING. SATURDAY THE REDS AGREED TO THE UN FIGURE OF 35,000 TROOPS TO BE ROTATED MONTHLY DURING AN ARMISTICE PERIOD, BUT BOTH SIDES WERE STILL ONE ENTRY PORT APART. THE REDS DEMANDS SIX AND THE COMMUNISTS ARE HOLDING OUT FOR FIVE.

ITEM FIVE REMAINS DEADLOCKED OVER RED EFFORTS TO BRING RUSSIA IN AS A NEUTRAL NATION TO INSPECT BEHIND THE LINES DURING A TRUCE.

THE COMMUNISTS CAN NOMINATE ANOTHER NATION TO REPLACE RUSSIA OR CHOOSE ALL THEIR TRUCE INSPECTORS FROM POLAND AND CZECHOSLOVAKIA ALONE.

HOUSE CONSIDERS NEW GI BILL

AN IMPORTANT HOUSE SPECIAL COMMITTEE HAS PROPOSED A NEW BILL TO GIVE FREE SCHOOLING TO VETERANS OF THE PRESENT EMERGENCY.

THE BILL, BASICALLY THE SAME AS THE WORLD WAR II BILL, HAS PLUGGED ALL LOOPHOLES TO PREVENT RACKETEERING AND EXTRAVAGANCE.

THE BILL WOULD GIVE MEN IN THE SERVICE SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THE KOREAN CONFLICT ONE AND A HALF DAYS OF FREE SCHOOLING FOR EVERY DAY IN THE SERVICE. MAXIMUM SCHOOLING WOULD BE 36 MONTHS OR ENOUGH TIME TO COMPLETE A FULL COLLEGE COURSE FOR A DEGREE.

THE PAYMENTS WOULD BE PAID DIRECT TO THE VETERAN AT THE RATE OF \$110 MONTHLY FOR SINGLE MEN AND \$150 MONTHLY FOR MEN WITH DEPENDENTS. THIS WOULD BE FOR A FULL-TIME COURSE. FOR A THREE-QUARTER TIME COURSE SINGLE MEN WOULD RECEIVE \$80 AND MEN WITH DEPENDENTS \$110. HALF TIME STUDENTS WOULD RECEIVE \$50 IF SINGLE AND \$70 WITH DEPENDENTS.

STUDENTS COULD CHANGE THEIR

COURSE ONLY ONCE. NO SCHOOLS LISTED AS SUBVERSIVE WOULD BE PERMITTED AND PRIVATE-PROFIT SCHOOLS WOULD HAVE TO HAVE AT LEAST ONE-QUARTER OF THEIR STUDENT BODY NON-VETERANS. NO VOCATIONAL OR RECREATIONAL COURSES WOULD BE ALLOWED EXCEPT IN INDIVIDUAL CASES.

ON-THE-JOB AND ON-THE-FARM TRAINING WOULD BE ALLOWED. PAYMENTS WOULD BEGIN AT \$70 A MONTH FOR SINGLE MEN AND \$90 FOR MEN WITH DEPENDENTS. THESE WOULD BE REDUCED EVERY FOUR MONTHS UNTIL DEPLETED.

CONGRESSIONAL EXPERTS FEEL THAT THIS BILL IS THE ANSWER TO MANY OF THE FORMER DIFFICULTIES.

GENERAL MACARTHUR'S PERSONAL STAFF OF EIGHT MEN HAS BEEN CUT TO THREE ON ORDERS FROM WASHINGTON. THE PENTAGON SAYS THIS IS A ROUTINE PROCEDURE FOR A FIVE-STAFF GENERAL WITHOUT AN ASSIGNMENT. THE GENERAL HASN'T HAD AN ASSIGNMENT SINCE PRESIDENT TRUMAN RELIEVED HIM OF HIS FAR EAST DUTIES
