



THE "BIG THREE" TANK-SHELTER

THE "BIG THREE" PROBLEMS CONTINUE TO HOLD UP A KOREAN ARMISTICE.

1. "VOLUNTARY REPATRIATION"- THE REDS STILL INSIST THAT ALL PRISONERS BE RETURNED TO THEIR HOMETLAND REGARDLESS OF THEIR WISHES. THE UN WANTS TO GIVE PRISONERS A CHOICE IN THE MATTER.

2. "MILITARY AIRFIELDS"- ALTHOUGH TEMPORARILY SHELVED, THE PROBLEM OF WHETHER OR NOT THE REDS BE ALLOWED TO REBUILD AND CONSTRUCT MILITARY AIRFIELDS IN NORTH KOREA REMAINS UNSOLVED.

3. "NEUTRAL RUSSIA"- THE REDS ARE STILL SUBORNLY ATTEMPTING TO GAIN UN RECOGNITION OF RUSSIA AS A NEUTRAL NATION MEMBER OF BEHIND THE LINES INSPECTION TEAMS AFTER AN ARMISTICE IS SIGNED.

DURING THE LONG PERIOD OF PANMUNJOM ARMISTICE MEETINGS A MAJORITY OF THE MINOR DETAILS FOR EFFECTING A MILITARY ARMISTICE IN KOREA HAVE BEEN WORKED. FOR THE MOST PART, THESE THREE VITALLY IMPORTANT PROBLEMS ALONE REMAIN.

THE UNOFFICIAL ARMY MAGAZINE "ARMOR" SAYS THAT TANKS COULD BE USED TO HOUSE SOLDIERS SAFELY DURING AN ATOMIC ATTACK. THE MAGAZINE POINTED OUT THAT TANKS USED IN THE NEVADA ATOMIC TEST WERE ONLY MODERATELY DAMAGED BY THE EXPLOSIONS.

HEAVY TANKS, THE MAGAZINE SAID, COULD SURVIVE AN EXPLOSION AND CONTINUE FIGHTING. SOLDIERS TAKING REFUGE IN THE TANKS COULD BE MOVED QUICKLY TO NEW OFFENSIVE POSITIONS FOR A COUNTERATTACK.

BESIDES TANKS, THE MAGAZINE STATED, NO ADEQUATE PROTECTION HAS YET BEEN DEvised FOR FOOT SOLDIERS IN AN ATOMIC IMPACT AREA.

SENATOR JAMES DUFF OF PENNSYLVANIA SAID YESTERTAY THAT GENERAL EISENHOWER'S CHANCES OF BEING NOMINATED FOR PRESIDENT ARE GAINING HEADWAY EVERYDAY. THE SENATOR SAYS HE DOES NOT SHARE THE FEARS OF OTHERS THAT THE GENERAL CAN NOT WIN UNLESS HE ACTIVELY SEEKS THE NOMINATION.

Norway Sews
Up Olympic Games

NORWAY WON THE SIXTH WINTER OLYMPIC GAMES YESTERDAY WHEN ITS SOARING SKI JUMPERS SPREAD-EAGLED THE FIELD AND GAVE THE HOME TEAM FOUR PLACES FOR AN UNBEATABLE UNOFFICIAL SCORE OF 125 1/2 POINTS FOR ALL EVENTS.

ONLY THE UNITED STATES HAD A MATHEMATICAL CHANCE OF BEATING THE NORWEGIANS BEFORE THE FINAL EVENT OF THE GAMES, THE ICE HOCKEY WIND-UP, BUT THE AMERICANS FAILED TO MATCH THE CLASS OF GOLD MEDALIST ARNFINN BURGEMANN AND HIS TEAM MATES.

CONGRESS AT WORK

THE HOUSE OPENS DEBATE TODAY ON UNIVERSAL MILITARY TRAINING. THE LAW MAKERS HAVE SET THE WEEK OF MARCH 2 FOR A FINAL VOTE ON THE MEASURE. THE SENATE ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEE HAS APPROVED A COMPANION UMT BILL, BUT A SENATE FLOOR FIGHT MAY BE DELAYED UNTIL THE HOUSE COMPLETES ITS ACTION.....

Teams Reshuffle

UCLA HAS TAKEN UNDISPUTED POSSESSION OF FIRST PLACE IN THE SOUTHERN DIVISION OF THE PACIFIC COAST CONFERENCE ON THE STRENGTH OF TWO WINS OVER THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA BEARS, WHO HAVE LED THE DIVISION MOST OF THE SEASON.

THEY MOVED INTO A TIE WITH THE BEARS FRIDAY NIGHT WHEN THEY DOWNED THE CALIFORNIA SQUAD 67-54; SUNDAY NIGHT, WITH THE CONFERENCE DEAD AS A GOAL, THEY ROLLED OVER THE STAGGERING BEARS 68-42.

MEANWHILE, THE STANFORD INDIANS ROLLED UP A DOUBLE WIN OVER THE TROJANS OF USC TO CLIMB INTO A SECOND PLACE TIE WITH CALIFORNIA JUST ONE GAME BEHIND UCLA. THE INDIANS DEFEATED THE TROJANS 51-41, FRIDAY, AND DID IT AGAIN SUNDAY NIGHT, 73-65.

IN NORTHERN DIVISION PLAY, WASHINGTON STATE AND OREGON SPLIT A TWO GAME SERIES. OREGON STRENGTHENED ITS THIRD PLACE SPOT BY DOWNING THE COMBERS 71-61 FRIDAY NIGHT, BUT FELL TO THE STATE CREW 57-65 SUNDAY NIGHT.

ELSEWHERE, THE NORTHERN DIVISION CHAMPS, THE WASHINGTON HUSKIES, SQUEEZED A 52-50 WIN OUT OF WYOMING FRIDAY AND LOST TO THE WYOMING QUINTET SATURDAY 55 TO 45.
