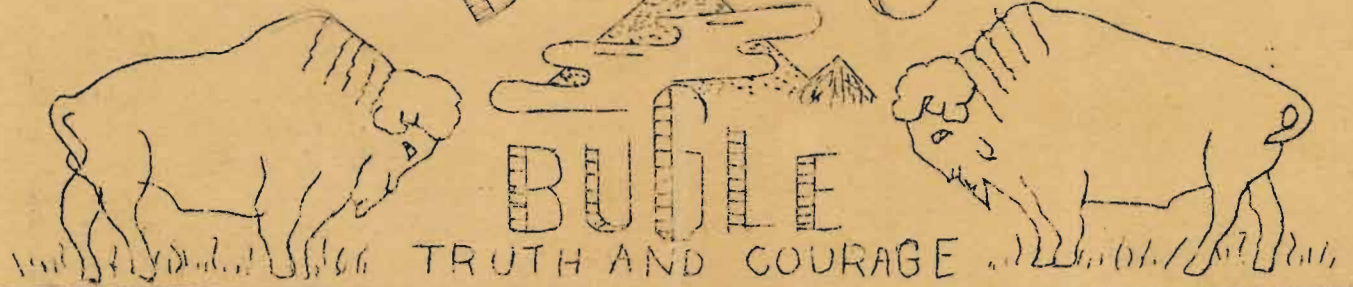

## BRAVE KOREAN "BUFFALO"

### AWARDED BRONZE STAR MEDAL

WHEN AN ATTACK BY "LOVE" COMPANY WAS STOPPED AFTER SIX HOURS OF PUSHING, KIM HO WON, 24, A CORPORAL IN THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA ARMY, LEFT HIS JAMMED MACHINEGUN TO BREAK UP THE ENEMY'S RESISTANCE.

EXCHANGING HIS CARBINE FOR AN M-1 CARRIED BY A MEMBER OF THE MACHINEGUN CREW, KIM RAN PAST THE LEAD ELEMENTS OF THE ATTACK WHO WERE PINNED DOWN BY ENEMY FIRE AND WENT TO THE TOP OF THE HILL ALONE.

CORPORAL KIM WAVED "LOVE" COMPANY FORWARD WHILE HE THREW ABANDONED GRENADES AFTER THE FLEEING ENEMY.

THE ATTACK, BEGUN AT EIGHT IN THE MORNING, CONTINUED UNTIL TWO IN THE AFTERNOON WITHOUT THE AMERICANS SECURING THE RED-HELD HILL. KIM, AN ASSISTANT TO GUNNER CPL WILLIAM ANDRUS, GAVE COVER FIRE OVER THE HEADS OF THE SLOWLY ADVANCING AMERICANS. AT LAST, FURTHER ADVANCE SEEMED IMPOSSIBLE.

WHEN HIS MACHINEGUN JAMMED, KIM SET OUT RUNNING, FIRING FROM THE HIP. MORE THAN 300 YARDS LAY BETWEEN HIM AND THE COMMUNIST'S DEFENSIVE TRENCH ACROSS THE FACE OF A HILL. STRATEGICALLY SITUATED, THE RED MACHINEGUNNER AND A SNIPER HAD BROUGHT THE AMERICANS TO A STANDSTILL.

SFC JOE ROGERS, 19, AND SFC ROBERT PYLE, 22, AT THE FRONT OF THE ATTACK, WERE THROWING GRENADES INTO THE ENEMY TRENCH WHEN KIM, DRAWING A TREMENDOUS VOLUME OF AUTOMATIC WEAPONS FIRE, BY-PASSED THEM. SUPPORT FIRE FROM THE REAR CONTINUED UNTIL KIM WAS WITHIN YARDS OF THE ENEMY. WITH A GRENADE HE IMMEDIATELY KNOCKED OUT THE KEY MACHINEGUNNER. STILL FIRING HIS RIFLE, HE CONTINUED ALONG THE TRENCH TO THE ENEMY SNIPER'S POSITION AND BAYONETED HIM. THE ACTION BROKE THE RED LINE.

## TAFT, KEFAUVER WIN

### PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARIES

WITH THE NEBRASKA RETURNS ALMOST COMPLETE IT IS APPARENT THAT SENATOR TAFT HAS WON IN THAT STATE GOVERNOR STASSEN WAS THE ONLY REPUBLICAN CANDIDATE ACTUALLY LISTED ON THE BALLOT. HOWEVER, TAFT POLLED 64,000 WRITE-IN VOTES. GENERAL EISENHOWER RAN SECOND WITH 48,000 WRITE-INS, WHILE STASSEN WAS THIRD WITH 43,000.....ON THE DEMOCRATIC

SIDE, KEFAUVER DEFEATED OKLAHOMA SENATOR KERR. KEFAUVER RECEIVED OVER 51,000 VOTES TO KERR'S 34,000

TAFT WON 24 OF 30 DELEGATES IN WISCONSIN. THE REMAINING SIX WENT TO CALIFORNIA'S GOVERNOR EARL WARREN. KEFAUVER WON 35% OF THE DEMOCRATIC VOTE IN WISCONSIN. HE WAS THE ONLY DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATE LISTED.

COMMENTING ON THE ELECTION, HAROLD STASSEN SAID THAT TAFT'S FAILURE TO WIN HALF OF THE POPULAR VOTES IN WISCONSIN WAS A REPUDIATION OF THE TAFT FOREIGN POLICY. TAFT SAID HE CONSIDERED THE VICTORY IN WISCONSIN MORE IMPORTANT THAN THAT IN NEBRASKA.

SENATOR HENRY CABOT LODGE, LEADER OF THE EISENHOWER FOR PRESIDENT MOVEMENT IN THE U.S., HAS COME TO EUROPE FOR TALKS WITH THE GENERAL. LODGE SAID HE WOULD NOT ASK THE GENERAL TO COME HOME, BUT DECLINED TO SAY WHAT HE WILL DISCUSS WITH THE GENERAL....

IN WASHINGTON, ACTING DEFENSE MOBILIZER JOHN STEELMAN, IS CONSIDERING SEIZURE OF THE STEEL INDUSTRY AS A POSSIBILITY IN PREVENTING A NATIONWIDE WALKOUT SCHEDULED FOR APRIL 8. MEANWHILE, THE KAISER STEEL CORPORATION ANNOUNCED IT HAS SIGNED A CONTRACT WITH THE CIO STEEL WORKERS.....

QUEEN JULIANA OF THE NETHERLANDS ARRIVED IN WASHINGTON YESTERDAY MORNING ON A GOODWILL TOUR OF THE UNITED STATES. PRESIDENT TRUMAN WAS AT THE AIRPORT TO WELCOME THE DUTCH MONARCH. A CANNON BOOMED A 21-GUN SALUTE AND HONOR GUARDS PRESENTED ARMS AS THE PRESIDENT SHOOK HANDS WITH THE ROYAL VISITOR.....

A SCOLARLY STATE DEPT EXPERT ON RUSSIA, GEORGE KENNAN, WAS SWORN IN YESTERDAY AS THE NEW U.S. AMBASSADOR TO THE SOVIET UNION.

HIS MOTHER, A SISTER AND BROTHER NOW LIVE IN YONG-DONG-PO. PRIOR TO THE WAR, KIM WAS EMPLOYED BY THE RAILROAD IN WONJU, SOUTH KOREA.
