W NYLON ARMOR VEST SAVES

PFC LOUIS E. MULLIKIN HAS MUCH PRAISE FOR THE NYLON BODY ARMOR VEST NOW BEING SURVEYED IN KOREA FOR ITS ADAPTABILITY BY THE NEARTRY. HIT IN THE CENTER OF HIS BACK BY A PIECE OF MORTAR SHRAPMEL HE VEST FOR HIS LIFE.

AN "ITEM" COMPANY PATROL WAS DISPATCHED TO RECONNOITER ENEMY HELD FORTHILLS. THE PATROL COM-ITS MISSION AMD WAS RE-TURNING TO BASE IN A WELL DIS-PERSET DIAMOND FORMATION WHEN ENEMY MORTAR ROUNDS LANDED FIVE

IN THE VICINITY. MULLIKIN WAS AT THE BIGHT OF THE FORMATION WHEN ONE BEAR 82MM ROUTED LANGED WITHIN SEVEN YARDS OF HIM. THE EXPLOSION SENT PIECES OF SHRAPPEL INTO HIS RIGHT THIGH, BUTTOCKS AND ARM, BUT HE WAS UNAWARE OF THE PIECE THAT HIT

HIS BACK.

CAPT LEGNARD K. PIERCE, COM-MANDER OF BODY ARMOR TEAM NUMBER INSPECTED THE VEST WORN BY MULLIKIN AND DISCOVERED THE SCAR SHRAPNEL . BY THE CAPTAIN PIERCE VISITED AT THE MULLIKIN HOSPITAL, SHOWING HIM THE VEST. MULLIKIN PRAISED THE VEST HIGHLY AND SAID HE WOULD NOT GO WITHOUT VEST IF THEY WERE AVAILABLE. THE BUDY ARMOR VEST IS MAD

I'S MADE OF MYLON COVERED LAYERS WITH WATERPROOF PONCHO CLOTH. S FURNISHED UNDER THIS PROTECTION IS ANMON NYLON LAYERS. A LAYER OF SPONGE RUSSER WHICH THERE TO REDUCE THE SHOCK F FROM

ANYTHING WHICH MAY HIT THE OUT-SIDE OF THE VEST. ACCOMDING TO CAPTAIN PIERCE, OF ALL BATTLE CASUAL-BY FRACMENTS AND NOT TIES ARE ARMS. THOSE MOST LIKELY TO DEATH ARE THE ONES IN THE MM, CHEST AND HEAD AREAS. SMALL STOWACH, CHEST AND HE THE VEST IS DESIGNED TO STOP SUCH SUD ERAGMENTS REDUCE THE NUMBER THE OF WOUNDS IN STOMACH CHEST AREAS.

GERMAN COLD WAR

THE COMMUNISTS ARE WILLING TO ACCEPT THE FIRST TWO POINTS BUT
