



GENERALS, NEWSMEN VISIT BUFFALO REGT

FRONT LINE TROOPS OF THE 17TH WERE VIEWED SUNDAY BY FOUR HIGH RANKING UN GENERALS AND TWO NOTABLE NEW YORK NEWSPAPERMEN.

GEN. JAMES A. VAN FLEET, COMMANDER OF THE EIGHTH ARMY IN KOREA, ACCOMPANIED BY MAJ. GEN. WILLARD WYMAN, NINTH CORPS COMMANDER, MAJ. GEN. L.L. LEMNITZER, 7TH DIVISION COMMANDER, BRIG. GEN. HARRY MC K. OPER, COMMANDER OF THE 7TH DIVISION ARTILLERY, AND ARTHUR HAYS SULZBURGER, EDITOR OF THE NEW YORK TIMES, AND HAROLD B. HINTON, WASHINGTON CORRESPONDENT FOR THE SAME PAPER, VISITED THE "BUFFALO" REGIMENT.

THE VIP'S WERE GREETED BY COL. RICHARD A. RISEN AND HIS STAFF. AFTER A SHORT BRIEFING AT REGIMENTAL HEADQUARTERS, THEY WERE DIRECTED TO A FRONT LINE OBSERVATION POST TO OVERLOOK THE ENEMY SITUATION. THE PARTY WAS PLEASED WITH THE APPEARANCE OF THE AREA AND THE SPIRIT OF THE MEN. SEVERAL PLEASING REMARKS WERE BESTOWED UPON COLONEL RISEN IN BEHALF OF THE ENTIRE REGIMENT.

MR. SULZBURGER AND MR. HINTON ARE MAKING A FRONT LINE INSPECTION OF ALLIED POSITIONS IN KOREA.

EISENHOWER HOME TO BID FOR NOMINATION

GENERAL DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER ARRIVED IN WASHINGTON YESTERDAY "FOR KEEPS" TO CLOSE HIS MILITARY LIFE AND LAUNCH A BID FOR THE REPUBLICAN PRESIDENTIAL NOMINATION. THE 61-YEAR-OLD STATESMAN STEPPED OFF HIS OFFICIAL PLANE WITH MRS. EISENHOWER TO SHAKE THE OUTSTRETCHED HANDS OF AN ARRAY OF MILITARY OFFICIALS AND GRINNED HAPPILY AT THE SCATTERED APPLAUSE OF SEVERAL SPECTATORS. SOME HELD "I LIKE IKE" BANNERS.

GENERAL EISENHOWER AND SENATOR TAFT COLLIDE THIS WEEK IN THEIR LAST PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY TESTS AS REPUBLICAN'S AND DEMOCRAT'S CHOSE A TOTAL OF 228 DELEGATES TO THEIR NATIONAL NOMINATING CONVENTIONS. THE TAFT-EISENHOWER CLASH FOR SOUTH DAKOTA'S 14 DELEGATES AND THE CALIFORNIA PRIMARY, BOTH ON WEDNESDAY, HIGHLIGHT THE LAST 316 WEEK OF DELEGATE SELECTION.

AT THE START OF THE CLIMATIC SEVEN DAYS A TABULATION OF DELEGATES CHOSEN SO FAR SHOWS TAFT WITH 420, AND EISENHOWER WITH 387. SOME 139 REMAIN TO BE CHOSEN. IT TAKES 604 VOTES TO WIN THE NOMINATION.

AMONG THE DEMOCRATS, SENATOR ESTES KEFAUVER HAS 175, AVERELL HARRIAMN 95, SENATOR RICHARD RUSSEL 84, AND ROBERT KERR 43. STILL TO BE CHOSEN ARE 260 DELEGATES. THE DEMOCRATIC NOMINATION REQUIRES 616 VOTES.

PANMUNJOM:

A 26-MINUTE TOP LEVEL TRUCE SESSION WAS HELD AT PANMUNJOM YESTERDAY. THE TIME WAS TAKEN UP BY NORTH KOREAN GENERAL NAM IL'S CHARGES AGAINST THE UN'S REFUSAL TO RETURN PRISONERS OF WAR AGAINST THEIR WISHES.

ON THE GROUND YESTERDAY, UN FORCES CONTINUED THEIR PATROL JOBS BUT ONLY LIGHT CONTACT WAS REPORTED WITH THE REDS.

WORLD NEWS

THE COMMUNISTS HAVE STRENGTHENED THE IRON CURTAIN SURROUNDING EAST GERMANY. RED AUTHORITIES HAVE ORDERED THAT NONE OF THE TWO AND A HALF MILLION WEST BERLINERS WILL BE ALLOWED INSIDE THE SOVIET SECTOR. FREE GERMANS ARE REQUIRED TO LEAVE ALL ELEVATED TRAINS WHEN THEY ENTER THE EASTERN ZONE.

SO FAR, THERE HAVE BEEN NO ATTEMPTS TO CUT OFF WEST BERLIN FROM WEST GERMANY. THOUGH THE REDS ARE STILL STOPPING AMERICAN AND BRITISH PATROLS FROM ENTERING THE SUPER HIGHWAY CONNECTING BERLIN WITH WEST GERMANY. NO MILITARY TRAFFIC CONTINUES TO RUN SMOOTHLY.

ANOTHER ATOMIC TEST HAS BEEN SET OFF IN THE NEVADA DESERT. THIS EXPLOSION— THE SEVENTH AND LAST OF THE CURRENT SERIES AT THE YUCCA FLAT TESTING GROUNDS— WAS DETONATED YESTERDAY MORNING WHILE 1,000 TROOPS WERE SHELTERED IN FOX HOLES ABOUT FOUR MILES FROM GROUND ZERO, THE CENTER OF THE BLAST. WITHIN SECONDS AFTER THE EXPLOSION, THE TROOPS MOVED OUT OF THEIR FOX HOLES TOWARD THE SITE OF THE ATOMIC BLAST. TANKS AND ARMY SAFETY DEVICE TEAMS LED THE WAY.

A MAN WHO HAD PROBABLY MORE TO DO WITH MODERN EDUCATION TECHNIQUES IN AMERICA THAN ANY OTHER MAN DIED YESTERDAY. HE WAS 92-YEAR-OLD PHILOSOPHER JOHN DEWEY OF COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY TEACHERS COLLEGE. DEWEY SUCCEMDED TO AN ATTACK OF PNEUMONIA IN HIS NEW YORK HOME. KNOWN AS THE FATHER OF PROGRESSIVE EDUCATION, HIS VIEWS DID MUCH TO MODERNIZE THE AMERICAN SCHOOL SYSTEM.

TEN ARMY BOXERS, LED BY ZORA FOLLEY OF THE FAR EAST COMMAND, QUALIFIED FOR OLYMPIC TRYOUTS BY WINNING INDIVIDUAL TITLES IN THE ALL ARMY BOXING TOURNAMENT SUNDAY NIGHT. FOLLEY, WHO IS FROM THE EIGHTH ARMY, WAS NAMED THE OUTSTANDING BOXER OF THE FIVE-DAY TOURNAMENT, AS HE GAINED THE WORLD-WIDE HEAVYWEIGHT TITLE.

THE FIFTH ARMY WON THE TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP WITH A TOTAL OF 24 POINTS, WITH THE FAR EAST COMMAND SECOND WITH 17 POINTS.

FOLLEY SCORED THE ONLY TECHNICAL KNOCKOUT IN THE NIGHT'S TEN-BOUNDT CARD WITH A TKO OVER EUROPE'S WARREN GRAHAM. THE CHAMP DROVE GRAHAM ALONG THE ROPES WITH SOLID SMASHES TO THE HEAD AND BODY AND LEFT HIM DEFENSELESS AFTER TWO MINUTES AND FIFTY-EIGHT SECONDS OF THE SECOND ROUND.

THE OTHER FAR EAST COMMAND WINNER WAS BANTAMWEIGHT JOE NOBLEZA. HE DECISIONED GEORGE DAVIS IN THREE ROUNDS.

HEAVYWEIGHT CHAMPION JERSEY JOE WALCOTT AND EZZARD CHARLES, THE EX-CHAMP, GO AT EACH OTHER FOR THE FOURTH TIME THURSDAY NIGHT. CHARLES IS RATED A 12-5 FAVORITE. IF HE WINS HE WILL BECOME THE FIRST HEAVYWEIGHT CHAMP TO REGAIN HIS TITLE FOR THE SECOND TIME. THE BOUT WILL BE STAGED IN PHILADELPHIA'S MUNICIPAL STADIUM.
