



VOTE DUE ON GI BILL

THE BILL EXTENDING BENEFITS TO THOSE WHO SERVED IN KOREA CAME UP IN THE HOUSE YESTERDAY BUT ACTION WAS POSTPONED UNTIL FRIDAY. THE AUTHOR OF THE MEASURE, TEXAS CONGRESSMAN TEAGUE, URGED QUICK PASSAGE IN A PARLIAMENTARY MOVE THAT REQUIRED TWO-THIRDS APPROVAL AND PREVENTED AMENDMENT. SOME CONGRESSMEN SAID THEY WANTED TO LIMITATE THE PROVISIONS FOR DIRECT PAYMENT OF EDUCATION BENEFITS TO THE VETERAN INSTEAD OF THE SCHOOLS THEY ARE ATTENDING.

TENSION IN BERLIN

TENSION IS GROWING BETWEEN THE EAST AND WEST IN GERMANY. ARMED RUSSIAN SOLDIERS AND RED POLICE HAVE SET UP MACHINEGUNS AT STRATEGIC POINTS ALONG THE BORDER OF WEST BERLIN. THE REDS HAVE DUG THREE DITCHES IN SOME PLACES TO PREVENT WEST BERLINERS FROM ENTERING THE SOVIET SECTOR.

YESTERDAY FIVE BRITISH MILITARY POLICE DEFIED RUSSIAN TROOPS AND COMMUNIST POLICE WHO HAVE BEEN TRYING TO FORCE ALL PERSONS TO EVACUATE A SMALL BRITISH CONTROLLED SECTION OUTSIDE THE SOVIET ZONE. THE ARMED MP'S WERE SENT TO THE CLUSTER OF LONELY HOUSES TO PROTECT THE SETTLEMENT FROM RUSSIAN INTERFERENCE. THE RUSSIANS HAVE ALSO ORDERED RESIDENTS OF OTHER BRITISH CONTROLLED SECTORS INSIDE EAST GERMANY TO MOVE OUT. THE BRITISH HAVE SENT A NOTE TO THE RUSSIANS PROTESTING THE ORDER.

AT ONE POINT ALONG THE BORDER, A MOB OF 150 EAST GERMANIS CURSED AND THREATENED COMMUNIST POLICE. A SHOT HAD BEEN FIRED BY REDS AFTER AN EXCITED WEST BERLINER HAD SLAPPED THE FACE OF ONE OF THE POLICE GUARDS BLOCKING HIS ENTRY INTO THE SOVIET ZONE. THE COMMUNIST TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS WILL RESULT IN MANY BEING SEPARATED FROM FAMILIES AND JOBS.

STEEL MILLS IDLE, SEIZURE VOID

THE SUPREME COURT RULED YESTERDAY THAT THE ADMINISTRATION'S SEIZURE OF THE STEEL MILLS WAS UNCONSTITUTIONAL. IN A SIX TO THREE COURT RULING, THE HIGH TRIBUNAL SAID THERE WAS NOTHING IN THE CONSTITUTION, EITHER IMPLIED OR STATED OUTRIGHT, THAT WOULD GIVE THE PRESIDENT THE RIGHT TO SEIZE PRIVATE PROPERTY UNDER SUCH CONDITIONS. THE COURT SAID ONLY CONGRESS HAS THAT RIGHT.

IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE COURT ORDER, THE PRESIDENT ORDERED THE PLANT'S RETURN TO PRIVATE OWNERSHIP.

LESS THAN AN HOUR AFTER THE COURT'S DECISION, STEEL WORKERS PRESIDENT PHILLIP MURRAY ORDERED A NEW WALKOUT OF THE UNION'S 650,000 MEMBERS. PICKET LINES ARE BLOCKING STEEL PLANTS AROUND THE NATION.

THE WORKERS SAY THEY WON'T WORK WITHOUT A CONTRACT. THE CONTRACT THEY WANT INCLUDES HIGHER WAGES AND THE RIGHT TO A UNION SHOP. MURRAY CALLED ON THE STEEL COMPANIES TO JOIN IN NEGOTIATIONS ON A CONTRACT "BASED UPON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WAGE STABILIZATION BOARD." A SPOKESMAN FOR THE COMPANIES REPLIED THAT THE INDUSTRY IS READY "TO SIT DOWN WITH THE UNIONS WITHOUT DELAY TO TRY TO REACH A FAIR SETTLEMENT OF THE STEEL STRIKE." THE STEEL INDUSTRY, HOWEVER, HAS REJECTED THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WAGE STABILIZATION BOARD.

MR. TRUMAN HAS NOT INDICATED WHAT HIS NEXT MOVE WILL BE. STEPS ARE BEING TAKEN TO CONSERVE STEEL FOR DEFENSE PRODUCTION. INDICATIONS ARE THE STRIKE, IF IT CONTINUES, MAY RESULT IN THE LAYING OFF OF SOME WORKERS IN THE COAL, RAIL AND AUTO INDUSTRIES.

ON CAPITOL HILL, CONGRESSMEN GENERALLY APPROVED THE COURT'S FINDING.

WORLD NEWS

THE SOCIALIST PARTY SUNDAY NOMINATED JELLINGTON HOOPES OF READING, PA., AS THEIR PRESIDENTIAL CHOICE. PERENNIAL SOCIALIST CANDIDATE NORMAN THOMAS BOWED OUT THIS TIME AFTER TRYING FOR 24 YEARS TO BE ELECTED PRESIDENT.

GENERAL EISENHOWER'S FIRST FULL DAY IN WASHINGTON WAS A BUSY ONE. HE MET FIRST WITH NORTH ATLANTIC PACT OFFICIALS TO GIVE THEM AN UP TO THE MINUTE REPORT ON THE STATE OF EUROPEAN DEFENSES.

FOLLOWING A LUNCHEON IN THE OFFICE OF DEFENSE SECRETARY ROBERT LOVETT, THE GENERAL WENT TO THE WHITE HOUSE WHERE HE RECEIVED A FOURTH OAK LEAF CLUSTER ON HIS D.S.M.

SECRETARY OF STATE DEAN ACHESON TOLD THE REDS YESTERDAY THE UNITED STATES WILL PROTECT WEST GERMANY AND BERLIN FROM THE COMMUNISTS AND THEIR "INTIMIDATING GESTURES" SECRETARY ACHESON SPOKE OVER A NATIONWIDE RADIO-TV HOOKUP JUST AFTER PRESIDENT TRUMAN ASKED THE SENATE FOR SWIFT APPROVAL OF TWO AGREEMENTS THAT ADD UP TO A NEAR ALLIANCE BETWEEN WEST GERMANY AND THE UNITED STATES.

THE SECRETARY OF STATE SAID RUSSIA MUST HAVE "NO MISUNDERSTANDING" ABOUT HOW THE UNITED STATES WOULD REGARD ANY ACT BY THE SOVIET UNION OR ANY OTHER COUNTRY TO VIOLATE THE INTEGRITY OF THE NEW EUROPEAN DEFENSE COMMUNITY.

THE ARMISTICE NEGOTIATORS MET AT PANMUNJOM AGAIN YESTERDAY, THIS TIME FOR 31 MINUTES. NO PROGRESS WAS REPORTED. ANOTHER MEETING HAS BEEN SCHEDULED FOR TODAY AT THE COMMUNISTS REQUEST.

ON THE GR-UND YESTERDAY, ONLY LIGHT CONTACT WAS REPORTED WITH THE ENEMY.
