IKE STARTS CAMPAIGN

GENERAL EISENHOWER SPOKE AS A POLITICAL CANDIDATE YESTERDAY AT A RALLY IN HIS HOMETOWN, ABILENE, KANSAS. HE TOLD THE CHEERING THOUSANDS THAT ANY POLITICAL PARTY THAT HAS BEEN IN POWER FOR A LONG TIME BECOMES CORRUPT AND FOR THAT REASON THE PEOPLE SHOULD END WHAT HE CALLED EXTERNAL AND INTERNAL DANGERS FACING THE UNITED STATES.

HE POINTED TO "THE IMPLACABLE OSTILITIES OF THE POWERFUL COMMUNIST DICTATORSHIP" AND WARNED THAT IF THE REDS SUCCEED IN DOM-INATING THE WORLD, THEY COULD CUT AMERICA FROM NEEDED RAW MATERIALS.


HE ASKED FOR AN END TO THE SECRECY SURFIQUEDING FOREIGN RELATIONS. HE SAID FOREIGN FEELINGS MUST BE MADE PUBLIC TO GAIN "INTELLIGENT SUPPORT" FROM THE AMERICAN PEOPLE AND PREVENT FURTHER DIPLOMATIC SETBACKS LIKE THAT AT YALTA.

GENERAL EISENHOWER SPOKE OF THE BILLIONS ALREADY SPENT IN BUILDING OUR ALLIES UP MILITARILY AND ECONOMICALLY. HE SAID HE FAVORED THIS SUPPORT BUT PROMISED THE COST WOULD SOON DECREASE.

DOMESTIC/LLY, THE RETIRED FIVE-STAR GENERAL CALLED FOR GREATER UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN CAPITAL AND LABOR. HE SAID THE PROSPERITY OF ALL CLASSES IS ESSENTIAL TO A PROSPEROUS NATION.

HE ALSO ATTACKED EXCESSIVE TAXATION AND COVERNMENT SPENDING, AND CHARCED THE MATIONAL GOVERNMENT STATEMENT TAKING OVER FUNCTIONS THAT BELONG TO LOCAL COMMUNITIES.

THE LATEST REPORTS FROM THE SOUTH BAKOTA PRIMARY SHOW SENATOR TAFT LEADING GENERAL EISENHOWER BY SOME 550 VOTES. WITH NINE THOUSAND VOTES STILL TO BE COUNTED, THE SENATOR HAS 64,600, AND THE GENERAL 64.050.
