CAPTURED GUN NOW CEREMONIAL PIECE

AN OLD CAPTURED ENEMY WEAPON WITH THOUSANDS OF WORDS OF UNWRITTEN HISTORY BEHIND IT TAKES ITS STAND AS A CEREMONIAL GUN BEATH THE FLYING STARS AND STRIPES IN THE "BUFFALO" REGIMENT.

THE WEAPON, ONCE USED TO ROUND OUT SHELLS AT UNITED NATIONS FORCES HAS BEEN AMALGAMATED INTO THE BASIC ARMY TRADITION OF CEREMONY USED BY THE 17TH REGIMENT. IT IS A RECONDITIONED 75MM PACK MOUNTAIN HOWITZER BUILT IN THE UNITED STATES AND SENT TO CHINA DURING THE INFUX OF THE LEND-LEASE PROGRAM. IT WAS USED BY THE REDS IN THE KOREAN CONFLICT UNTIL MAY, 1951 WHEN THE REGIMENT CAPTURED IT.

THE OLD FIELD PIECE WAS THEN ADOPTED BY THE BUFFALOES AS A CEREMONIAL WEAPON USED FOR FIRING AT RETREAT.

IT IS KNOWN TO HAVE BEEN CAPTURED IN MAY, 1951 WHEN THE BUFFALOES MADE THEIR BIG PUSH INTO HWAJON IN A CLIMAXING THREE DAY BATTLE. THE BUFFALOES KNIFED INTO THE CENTER OF THE ENEMY FORCES, OVERRUNNING THEM BEFORE THEY COULD ESCAPE OR MOVE THEIR EQUIPMENT. FACED WITH VIRTUAL ANNIHILATION, GREAT NUMBERS OF THE TRAPPED COMMUNISTS THREW DOWN THEIR ARMS AND SURRENDERED.

"BAKER" COMPANY WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN CAPTURING THE WEAPON. SPEAHEADING THE DRIVE INTO HWAJON, BAKER COMPANY CUT OFF THE ESCAPE ROUTE FOR THOUSANDS OF ENEMY TROOPS. SURRENDER WAS THE ONLY ALTERNATIVE FOR THE ENEMY AND THEY THREW DOWN THEIR EQUIPMENT BEFORE THE OVERWHELMING UNFORCE. THE FIELD PIECE WAS FOUND BY BAKER COMPANY ALONG WITH SEVERAL PACK MULES USED BY THE ENEMY TO CARRY SUPPLIES AND PULL THEIR ARTILLERY PIECES.

HOUSE PASSES GI BILL, BILL GOES TO SENATE

THE HOUSE YESTERDAY SENT THE NEW SERVICEMAN'S BILL OF RIGHTS ON TO THE SENATE. THE LOWER CHAMBER OVERWHELMINGLY APPROVED THE MEASURE, 361 - 1. REP JAMES DEVEREUX, ONE TIME COMMANDER OF THE MARINES ON WAKE ISLAND, WAS THE LONE DISSENTER.

AN UNUSUAL PINK FIREBALL SPLASHED ACROSS THE NEVADA SKY BEFORE DAWN YESTERDAY MORNING. IT MARKED THE EIGHTH AND FINAL BLAST IN THE CURRENT SERIES OF ATOMIC TESTS.

GENERAL EISENHOWER ANSWERED A BARRAGE OF QUESTIONS FROM REPORTERS YESTERDAY MORNING. HE PROMISED TO BASE HIS CAMPAIGN ON THE "PEACE AND SECURITY OF THE WORLD."

THE GENERAL SAID HE FAVORED DECENTRALIZATION OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IN MANY PARTICULARS. HE SAID HE WOULD PREFER TO SEE THE INDIVIDUAL STATES ATTEND TO SUCH THINGS AS CIVIL RIGHTS, SOIL CONSERVATION AND SUBSIDIZED EDUCATION.

THE FORMER ATLANTIC PACT COMMANDER PRAISED GENERAL MACARTHUR AND SAID HE WOULD NOT HESITATE TO CALL ON HIM ON ASIAN MATTERS.

NO PROGRESS WAS REPORTED FROM YESTERDAY'S FRANCE MEETING.

FRANCE'S INTERIOR MINISTER SAYS HE HAS PROOF OF A COMMUNIST PLOT TO OVERTHROW THE GOVERNMENT. HE SAYS THAT THE BLOODY COMMUNIST RIOT OF MAY 26 WAS PART OF THAT PLOT. HE PLANNED TO ARREST MORE COMMUNIST LEADERS IF NECESSARY. THE LEADER OF THE FRENCH COMMUNIST, JACQUES DUCLOS, IS ALREADY BEING BARS OR CHARGES OF INCITING THE MAY 26 RIOT AGAINST GENERAL DEGASSE.

THE ARMY PLANS TO CALL UP 29,000 DRAFTES IN AUGUST.



WALCOTT DECISIONS CHARLES. DETAILS WILL APPEAR IN SUNDAY'S "BUGLE."

THE CAPTURED ITEMS WERE TURNED OVER TO SERVICE COMPANY. THE MULES WERE USED FOR CARRYING SUPPLIES UP THE RUGGED HILLS OF KOREA ELIMINATING A LOT OF HUMAN LABOR. THE CHINESE ARTILLERY PIECE WAS CONSIDERED A SOUVENIR AND KEPT WITH THE PURPOSE IN MIND TO USE IT FOR A CEREMONIAL FIRING PIECE.

THE WEAPON, SINCE THAT TIME, HAS BEEN KEPT IN BRIGHT AND SHINY CONDITION AND CARRIED WITH THE BUFFALOES WHEREVER THEY HAVE ROAMED. THE WEAPON DID PRESENT A PROBLEM AT FIRST. BLANK SHELLS FOR THE 75MM HOWITZER WERE NOT AVAILABLE, BUT ONE OF THE MEN WITH A KNOWLEDGE OF PYROTECHNICS PROVIDED

SOLUTION. HAND-MADE BLANK CARTRIDGES WERE PRODUCED FOR THE NIGHTLY FIRING AT RETREAT. BLACK POWDER WAS USED AT FIRST, BUT THIS BECAME A SCARCE ITEM. STAR CLUS-

CEREMONIAL GUN (CONTINUED)

TERS, SMOKE SHELLS AND PARACHUTE SHELLS WERE DESIGNED TO REPLACE THE BLANKS UNTIL THE SUPPLY CAUGHT UP WITH THE DEMAND.

THE SUPPLY OF 75MM PRIMERS WAS SOON EXHAUSTED SO 12 GAUGE SHOTGUN SHELLS WERE USED AS PRIMERS. THE SHELL CASING IS FILLED WITH GUN POWDER, PAPER, SAND, MELTED CANDLES AND THICK CARDBOARD.

ONLY ONCE SINCE ITS CAPTURE HAS THE WEAPON DONE DAMAGE TO FRIENDLY POSITIONS AND THIS WAS PURELY BY ACCIDENT. IN THE "PUNCH BOWL" AREA THE CANNONEER FAILED TO SIGHT THE PIECE PROPERLY AND THE CHARGE BLEW OUT COMMUNICATION LINES.

THE CEREMONIAL PIECE OWNS POSITION UNDER THE WAVING "OLD GLORY" FURNISHING A SOLEMN AND RESOUNDING SALUTE EACH NIGHT AT RETREAT.
