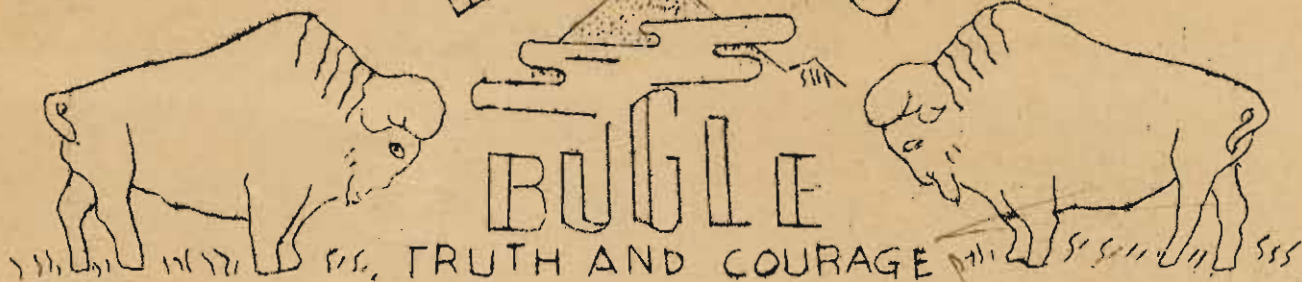

## "I COME TO WAGE PEACE"

EIGHT YEARS AGO YESTERDAY, MAJ. GEN. MATTHEW B. RIDGWAY ADJUSTED HIS PARACHUTE HARNESS AND LEAPED WITH HIS MEET ON UTAH BEACH IN FRANCE. YESTERDAY, THE FORMER COMMANDER OF THE 82ND AIRBORNE DIVISION, REVISITED THE D-DAY BEACHHEAD IN NORMANDY AS COMMANDER OF THE ATLANTIC PACT FORCES IN EUROPE. NOW WEARING FOUR STARS, GENERAL RIDGWAY WARNED THAT IF THE COMMUNISTS CHOOSE WAR, THEY WILL MEET DESTRUCTION.

THE GENERAL ACCUSED THE COMMUNISTS OF SETTING UP A DEADLIER TOTALITARIANISM THAN THE NAZI'S. HE TOLD THE REDS NOT TO MISTAKE THE PEACEFUL INTENTIONS OF THE FREE WORLD FOR WEAKNESS. HE SAID: "WE ARE NOT TODAY, WE NEVER HAVE BEEN, AND WE NEVER INTEND TO BECOME NATIONS THAT WALK WITH FEAR." THE GENERAL ADDED: "THE LAST TIME I WAS HERE, I WAS ONE OF THE THOUSANDS OF MEN WHO CAME TO WAGE WAR. THIS TIME I COME TO WAGE PEACE."

## THE COLD WAR

RUSSIA HAS EASED ITS BLOCKCADE AT ONE POINT IN GERMANY AND PULLED HER SENTRIES OUT OF ANOTHER SECTOR BUT HAS HANDED THE UNITED STATES A NEW ECONOMIC HEADACHE. THE RUSSIANS PULLED THEIR SENTRIES OUT OF THE LAKE GRIEBNIETZ AREA, A UNITED STATES SECTOR ON THE BORDER OF BERLIN AND EAST GERMANY, JUST TWENTY-FOUR HOURS BEFORE THE DEADLINE WAS SET FOR THEIR OUSTER BY AMERICAN OFFICIALS.

THE RUSSIANS ALSO PRESENTED THE UNITED STATES WITH A BILL FOR 14 MILLION DOLLARS. THE REDS SAY WE OWE THEM THAT FOR THEIR SERVICES IN KEEPING THE TELEPHONE LINES OPEN BETWEEN WEST GERMANY AND WEST BERLIN. AMERICAN AUTHORITIES SAY THE MOVE MAY BE JUST AN EXCUSE FOR THE RUSSIANS TO CUT THE CABLE.

## AMBASSADOR RECALLED

RUSSIA HAS RECALLED ALEXANDER PANYUSHKIN AS AMBASSADOR TO THE UNITED STATES AND HAS NAMED GEORGI ZARUBIN TO REPLACE HIM.

PANYUSHKIN SAYS HE WILL LEAVE FOR MOSCOW TOMORROW. THE STATE DEPARTMENT IS CONSIDERING WHETHER TO ACCEPT HIS SUCCESSOR, WHO WAS AMBASSADOR TO CANADA WHEN THE CANADIANS UNCOVERED A HUGE RUSSIAN ATOMIC SPY RING WITH ROOTS IN THE EMBASSY. THE CANADIAN COMMISSION WHICH INVESTIGATED THE CASE SAID ZARUBIN HAD NO KNOWLEDGE OF THE SPY RING OPERATING FROM THE EMBASSY AND THAT RUSSIAN SECRET AGENTS PURPOSELY KEEP ITS OPERATION FROM HIM.

STATE DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS BELIEVE PANYUSHKIN WAS RECALLED BECAUSE HE HAD OUTLIVED HIS USEFULNESS IN WASHINGTON. PANYUSHKIN IS A FAR EASTERN EXPERT AND HE WAS VALUABLE TO THE RUSSIANS UNTIL THE JAPANESE PEACE TREATY WAS SIGNED AND THE FAR EASTERN COMMISSION DISSOLVED.

## NEW BN. COMMANDERS

## WALCOTT RETAINS TITLE

Jersey Joe Walcott retained his heavyweight title by decisioning Ezzard Charles Thursday night. Walcott, 38-year-old father of six children, was blowing blood from his nose like an angry bull in the last round as he moved to the decision before a crowd officially estimated at 30,000 in the huge Philadelphia Municipal Stadium. Many of the spectators disagreed with the decision but nevertheless they joined in giving the Camden, New Jersey, champion a grand ovation when the decision was announced. He had won some of his rounds in an explosive fashion that threatened to KO Charles just as the challenger had been knocked out in their fight at Pittsburgh last July 18th.

Although sportswriters report it was a dull, tame bout, the fight talk now is that a million dollar shot appears to be next for Walcott with either Rocky Marciano or Kid Matthews. Promoter Jim Norris of the International Boxing Club has offered Walcott his choice for a title bout in September.

The International Olympic Organizing Committee announced yesterday that 71 nations, including Russia, have officially entered the Summer Games at Helsinki.
