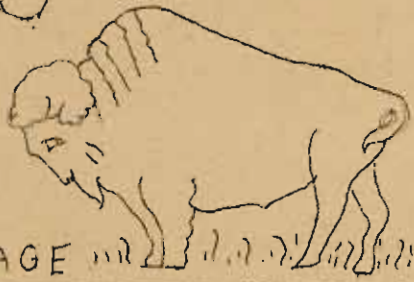

THE MAN TO SEE

THREE DAY RECESS

ONE SOLDIER WANTED TO FIND OUT WHY HE HADN'T BEEN RECEIVING ANY MAIL FROM HOME. ANOTHER WANTED LEGAL ADVICE. ANOTHER WAS JUST LOOKING FOR SOME WRITING PAPER AND A DECK OF CARDS. THE ANSWER TO THEM, IN EACH CASE, WAS THE SAME, "SEE MR. GROSECLOSE, HE CAN STRAIGHTEN YOU OUT."

AND MR GROSECLOSE HAS BECOME THAT POPULAR "MAN TO SEE" AS THE GENIAL, COMPETENT RED CROSS REPRESENTATIVE OF THE "BUFFALOES."

MR GROSECLOSE WAS SO ENTHUSIASTIC ABOUT HIS JOB THAT ONE TIME HE AND TWO DOUGHBOY ASSISTANTS TRAMPED 150 YARDS IN FRONT OF FRIENDLY LINES, PACKING DUFFLE BAGS OF STATIONERY AND TOILET ARTICLES FOR "BUFFALO" INFANTRYMEN. "I DIDN'T REALIZE WHERE WE WERE UNTIL WE CAME ACROSS AN OUTGOING FRIENDLY PATROL," EXPLAINED MR GROSECLOSE. "WE SURE GOT OUT OF THERE IN A HURRY."

A VETERAN OF WORLD WAR II, THE 31-YEAR-OLD RED CROSS WORKER ENJOYS HIS FRONT LINE ASSIGNMENT. "MY DUTIES KEEP ME CONSTANTLY ON THE GO," THE LITTLE SOUTHERNER SAID, "BUT IF I CAN HELP THE BOYS UP FRONT I FEEL I'VE BEEN SUCCESSFUL."

MANY REQUESTS FROM FAMILIES FOR REPORTS ON THE HEALTH AND WELFARE OF MEN WITHIN THE REGIMENT COME BEFORE MR GROSECLOSE. ACTING AS AN EMERGENCY LETTER AND CABLE SERVICE, THE RED CROSS OFFICE IS RELAYED THIS INFORMATION BY THE FRIENDLY "BUFFALO" FIELD DIRECTOR. ALONG WITH DISTRIBUTING STATIONERY AND SUNDRIES TO THE LINE COMPANIES, MR. GROSECLOSE HANDLES ALL ITEMS SENT THROUGH THE MAIN OFFICE.

MR GROSECLOSE HAS SERVED WITH THE 17TH FOR MORE THAN EIGHT MONTHS AND RECENTLY VOLUNTEERED FOR ANOTHER TOUR. "THE 'BUFFALOES' ARE A GOOD OUTFIT AND I LIKE WORKING FOR THEM," HE EXPLAINED.

ALLIED DELEGATES SET A THREE DAY RECESS IN THE KOREAN ARMISTICE CONFERENCE SATURDAY AND THEN WALKED OUT WHILE THE REDS WERE STILL DEMANDING DAILY SESSIONS. IT WAS THE SECOND THREE DAY RECESS IN THE ARMISTICE TALKS SET BY MAJ. GEN. WILLIAM K. HARRISON IN AN EFFORT TO GET SOME DIRECT ACTION TOWARD ENDING THE CONFERENCE STALEMATE ON THE EXCHANGE OF PRISONERS.

AS WAS THE CASE WHEN HE SET THE FIRST RECESS, GENERAL HARRISON SAID IT WAS APPARENT THE RED DELEGATES NEEDED TIME IN WHICH TO ACHIEVE A "REORIENTATION OF THEIR POSITION. GENERAL HARRISON HAS BEEN TRYING DAILY FOR THE PAST WEEK TO GET THE REDS TO AGREE TO A RECESS AS A METHOD OF GETTING SOME ACTION OTHER THAN A PROPAGANDA BLAST, BUT THE CHIEF RED DELEGATE REFUSED TO AGREE.

JIMMY DOOLITTLE OF WORLD WAR II FAME DISCLOSED YESTERDAY THE UNITED STATES HAS STOPPED BUILDING PROPELLER TYPE COMBAT AIRCRAFT. THE RETIRED AIR FORCE GENERAL MADE THE FURTHER PREDICTION THAT WITHIN FIVE YEARS, WE WILL HAVE AN ALL JET COMBAT AIR FORCE.

AS A CIVILIAN ADVISOR TO THE GOVERNMENT ON AIRCRAFT DEVELOPMENT, DOOLITTLE SPOKE AFTER TOURING ALLIED BASES IN THE FAR EAST. HE SAID, "THE ONLY FUTURE FOR THE PROPELLER AIRCRAFT WILL BE TRANSPORTS AND TRAINING PLANES.

FRENCH NAVAL AUTHORITIES, TRYING TO RUN-DOWN REPORTED REI PLOTS TO SABOTAGE THE NATION'S SEA DEFENSES, HAVE ORDERED RAIDS ON COMMUNIST FRONT ORGANIZATIONS IN FOUR BIG PORT CITIES IN FRANCE AND ALGERIA.

AT THE SAME TIME, THE FRENCH POLICE ARE CONTINUING THEIR RAID AGAINST COMMUNIST HEADQUARTERS IN AND AROUND PARIS. THEY ARE IN QUEST OF PAPERS TO BOLSTER THE CASE AGAINST THE REDS IN FRANCE.

WORLD NEWS

PRESIDENT TRUMAN YESTERDAY DENOUNCED AS "NONSENSE" SENATOR TAFT'S CLAIM THAT A HUGE AIR FORCE IS THE ANSWER TO U.S. SECURITY AND WOULD SAVE BILLIONS IN DEFENSE COSTS. THE PRESIDENT ALSO ANSWERED CHARGES THAT THE U.S. HAS BEEN COMPLETELY "OUTCLASSED" IN THE AIR WAR OVER KOREA WITH THE ASSERTION THAT "OUR PLANES HAVE KNOCKED OUT THE RED PLANES AT THE RATE OF EIGHT TO ONE."

HE TOLD MEMBERS OF THE 35TH DIVISION, HIS WORLD WAR I COMRADES: "WE CAN WIN THE PEACE AND WE ARE GOING TO WIN THE PEACE."

THE WAR OF NERVES STEPPED UP IN GERMANY. IN BERLIN, RUSSIA HAS TOLD THE ALLIES THAT IT WANTS DAILY PAYMENTS FOR THE USE OF THE RAILROAD CONNECTING WEST BERLIN WITH WEST GERMANY. PREVIOUSLY, THE PAYMENTS WERE MADE TWICE A MONTH.

TAFT VICTORY

THE INDIANA REPUBLICAN CONVENTION APPROVED A SLATE OF 32 NATIONAL CONVENTION DELEGATES FOR SENATOR ROBERT TAFT FRIDAY IN A WILD SESSION AT INDIANAPOLIS. TWO DELEGATES ANNOUNCED IMMEDIATELY THEY WILL IGNORE THE ACTION.

SINCE THE "UNANIMOUS" TAFT MOTION IS NOT LEGALLY BINDING, THE SLATE IS ASSUMED TO REMAIN SO FOR TAFT AND TWO FOR GENERAL EISENHOWER IN SO FAR AS AN OFFICIAL TABULATION IS CONCERNED.

WHITE HOUSE SPONSORED NEGOTIATIONS ON THE STEEL STRIKE RESUMED AGAIN YESTERDAY IN AN EFFORT TO SETTLE UNION DEMANDS FOR A WAGE INCREASE AND A UNION SHOP. NO PROGRESS HAS BEEN REPORTED FROM THE SESSION.
