## "WILLIAM'S" RIBBON ON DISPLAY

WILLIAM THE BUFFALO'S PRIZE BLUE RIBBON IS NOW LOCATED IN THE ARCHIVES OF THE "BUFFALO" REGIMENT IN KOREA. THE RIBBON WAS AWARDED TO THE 17TH REGIMENT'S MASCOT AT THE FLORIDA STATE FAIR IN FEBRUARY. IT WAS RECEIVED MAY 7 BY COL. RICHARD A. RISDEN, COMMANDING OFFICER OF THE BUFFALOES.

WILLIAM IS THE OFFICIAL MASCOT OF THE 17TH. THE 500-POUND BISON CALF WAS PRESENTED TO THE REGIMENT BY A BUFFALO RANCHER, GENE CLARK OF INDEPENDENCE, KANSAS. WILLIAM HAS BEEN KEPT IN THE STATES AS IT IS IMPOSSIBLE FOR HIM TO BE TRANSPORTED TO KOREA. CLARK IS KEEPING HIM UNTIL SUCH TIME THE 17TH RETURNS TO THE STATES.

IN FEBRUARY, WILLIAM WAS ENTERED IN THE FLORIDA STATE FAIR AT WHICH TIME HE WAS PROCLAIMED THE GRAND CHAMPION BUFFALO BULL. HE WAS THE FIRST BUFFALO TO BE GIVEN THIS TITLE IN THE HISTORY OF FAIR BUSINESS.

COL. WILLIAM W. "BUFFALO BILL" QUINN, FORMER COMMANDER OF THE 17TH IN KOREA, WHO IS NOW IN THE STATES, WAS GRANTED A SPECIAL LEAVE FROM HIS DUTIES IN THE PENTAGON TO ACCEPT THE AWARD FOR "WILLIAM." THE FAIR ASSOCIATION PRESENTED THE RIBBON TO CLARK WHO IN TURN PRESENTED IT TO COLONEL QUINN. AFTER THE RIBBON MADE THE ROUNDS IN THE PENTAGON IT WAS PACKED AND SHIPPED TO COLONEL RISDEN TO BE PROPERLY DISPLAYED IN KOREA. IT IS NOW BEING DISPLAYED IN THE SECOND BATTALION HEADQUARTERS.

THE RIBBON IS AN ELABORATE AFFAIR ENCASED IN A PICTURE FRAME. UNDER THE RIBBON ARE THE WORDS, "WILLIAM THE BUFFALO, 500 POUNDS, BULL CALF MASCOT OF THE 17TH 'BUFFALO REGIMENT' FIGHTING IN KOREA. WAS PROCLAIMED GRAND CHAMPION BUFFALO BULL AT THE FLORIDA STATE FAIR."

## truce recess

THERE WAS NO MEETING OF TOP ARMISTICE NEGOTIATORS IN PANNUNJOM YESTERDAY MORNING. THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND HAS DECLARED A RECESS IN TALKS UNTIL WEDNESDAY TO LET THE REDS CONVINCE THEMSELVES THAT THE ALLIES WILL NOT RETREAT FROM THEIR OPPOSITION TO FORCE REPATRIATION OF PRISONERS OF WAR. SUNDAY A COMMUNIST LIAISON OFFICER DEMANDED THE MEETINGS BE HELD. A UN COMMAND SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED THAT THE ALLIED ARMISTICE DELEGATES WILL MEET BEFORE WEDNESDAY IF THE REDS WOULD STATE IN WRITING "THE SPECIFIC PROPOSALS WHICH THEY WOULD MAKE REGARDING SUCH MATTERS."

THE DEPUTY COMMANDER OF THE TURKISH BRIGADE WAS REPORTED KILLED BY A MORTAR FRAGMENT. 51-YEAR-OLD COLONEL NUR PANIR WAS STRUCK IN THE HEAD DURING A FRONT LINE INSPECTION ON JUNE 5. MOSLEM BURIAL SERVICES WILL BE HELD TODAY AT THE UN CEMETERY AT PUSAN.

## Van Fleet confident

GENERAL VAN FLEET SAYS THE EIGHTH ARMY WILL DEFEAT ANY OFFENSIVE THE REDS MAY "FOOLISHLY DECIDE TO LAUNCH IN KOREA." THE EIGHTH ARMY COMMANDER SAID THE MORALE OF HIS TROOPS HAS "ALMOST" REACHED THE POINT OF WISHING THE ENEMY WOULD ATTACK.

PRESIDENT TRUMAN IS EXPECTED TO GET THE SIX AND A HALF BILLION DOLLAR MUTUAL SECURITY AUTHORIZATION TODAY. ADMINISTRATION FORCES ARE CONFIDENT THE HOUSE WILL APPROVE THE COMPROMISE MEASURE ALREADY PASSED BY THE HOUSE. THE BILL WOULD AUTHORIZE MILITARY, ECONOMIC AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO NON-COMMUNIST NATIONS.

CAPITAL NEWS

CONGRESSIONAL LAW MAKERS ARE WORKING "UNDER THE GUN" TO WRAP UP ESSENTIAL LEGISLATION SO THEY CAN CALL IT QUITS THIS YEAR.

THE LAW MAKERS SEEK TO AVOID ANOTHER SESSION AFTER THE NATIONAL PARTY CONVENTIONS IN CHICAGO, AND HOUSE DEMOCRATIC "WHIP" J. PERCY PRIEST SAYS THEY MAY BEAT THE DEADLINE. HE SAID THE 82ND CONGRESS HAS A GOOD CHANCE OF WINDING UP ITS WORK AND HEADING FOR VACATIONS, CONVENTIONS AND CAMPAIGNING BY JULY 3.

WORD IN WASHINGTON IS THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAS DECIDED TO LOWER DOWN PAYMENTS REQUIRED ON NEW HOUSES. INFORMED OFFICIALS SAY THE FEDERAL RESERVE BOARD REGULATION CONTROLLING REAL ESTATE WILL BE MODIFIED TODAY ON HOMES IN ALL PRICE BRACKETS.

BUILDERS HAVE BEEN COMPLAINING LATELY THAT CONTROLS ARE NO LONGER NEEDED TO FIGHT INFLATION.

THE U.S. AMBASSADOR TO INDIA, CHESTER BOWLES, IS DUE IN WASHINGTON TODAY AND HE IS EXPECTED TO URGE ACCEPTANCE OF HIS PLAN TO AID INDIA. THE FORMER CONNECTICUT GOVERNOR IS SAID TO HAVE WORKED OUT A ONE BILLION DOLLAR, FOUR-YEAR PLAN FOR AMERICAN AID TO INDIA.

THE PLAN IS DESIGNED TO HELP PRIME MINISTER NEHRU'S GOVERNMENT CARRY OUT ITS OWN FIVE YEAR PLAN BY BOLSTERING DEFICIENT FOOD PRODUCTION.

IN BOSTON, THE RED SOX DEFEATED THE TIGERS TWICE BY THE SCORES OF 5-2 AND 5-2.

IN A SINGLE GAME, THE WHITE SOX DOWNED THE WASHINGTON SENATORS, 6-3.

IN THE NATIONAL LEAGUE THE BROOKLYN DODGERS DEFEATED CINCINNATI TWICE, 11-7 AND 10-4.

BIG HANK SAUER HIT HIS 14TH HOMER OF THE SEASON AS THE CUBS WON THE FIRST GAME OF A DOUBLE-HEADER FROM THE BOSTON BRAVES, 6-3. IN THE SECOND GAME THE BRAVES STOPPED BOB RUSH'S WINNING STREAK AS THEY EDGED THE CUBS, 7-6.

THE CARDS DUMPED THE PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES, 5-3, AND THE NEW YORK GIANTS RAN OVER THE LOW PITTSBURGH PIRATES, 9-1 IN SINGLE GAMES.
