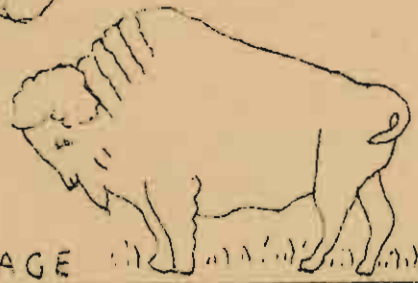
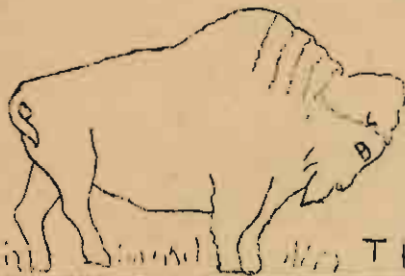

COMMEMORATIVE ADDRESS

EIGHT YEARS AGO THE EIGHTH U.S. ARMY WAS BORN AS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES. HISTORY CHRONICLES THE FACT THAT THE EIGHTH ARMY WAS DESTINED TO BE A PRIMARY BULWARK AGAINST COMMUNIST AGGRESSION. FOR NEARLY TWO YEARS OUR ARMY HAS FIGHTED ALONG THE COMMUNIST FRONTIER IN THE FAR EAST AND DURING THAT TIME, WE, TOGETHER WITH OUR UNITED NATIONS ALLIES, HAVE ACCOMPLISHED OUR MISSION OF REPELLING THE AGGRESSOR.

AS THE EIGHTH U.S. ARMY COMMANDER, I EXTEND TO THE PERSONNEL OF THE COMMAND SINCERE COMMENDATION FOR A JOB MAGNIFICENTLY EXECUTED. I REITERATE MY HOPE FOR AN HONORABLE PEACE HOWEVER, IN EVENT OF ANY MOVE BY THE AGGRESSOR, I HAVE COMPLETE CONFIDENCE AND UNBOUNDED FAITH IN COURAGE AND CAPABILITIES OF YOU WHO SERVE YOUR COUNTRY IN A MOST DIFFICULT MISSION.

ACTION AT KOJE

AMERICAN PARATROOPERS YESTERDAY BROKE INTO MANY PRISON COMPOUNDS ON KOJE ISLAND. THE PARATROOPERS STORMED COMPOUND 76 AFTER THE PRISONERS IGNORED ORDERS TO ASSEMBLE AND PREPARE TO MOVE INTO NEW COMPOUNDS. THE BATTLE WITH THE REDS LASTED FOR OVER TWO AND ONE HALF HOURS.

AT LEAST 100 PRISONERS WERE TREATED FOR WOUNDS, AND 30 COMMUNISTS AND ONE AMERICAN SOLDIER WERE KILLED. MANY OF THE RED CASUALTIES WERE INFLICTED BY COMMUNIST FANATICS TRYING TO STOP OTHER PRISONERS FROM SURRENDERING.

LATER IN THE DAY, REDS IN NEARBY COMPOUND 78 MEETLY OBEYED ORDERS AND BEGAN MOVING OUT TO NEW, 500-MAN COMPOUNDS. THE SIX THOUSAND PRISONERS IN THIS COMPOUND WERE OBVIOUSLY CHAVER BY THE SHOW OF FORCE IN COMPOUND 76.

THE RUSSIANS HAVE PULLED OUT OF TWO DISPUTED AREAS AFTER A PROTEST BY BRITAIN AND THE UNITED STATES.

THE RUSSIANS APPARENTLY MOVED OUT OF THE BORDER AREAS TO FORCE THE BRITISH TO REOPEN THE RUSSIAN RADIO STATION IN THE BRITISH SECTOR OF BERLIN.

THE THREE DAY RECESS OF ARMISTICE TALKS HAS BEEN COMPLETED. THE DELEGATES WERE SCHEDULED TO MEET AGAIN THIS MORNING.

LABOR SAVER

TRAMWAYS ARE COMMONLY USED ON THE KOREAN FRONT, BUT NONE ARE QUITE LIKE THE ONE CONSTRUCTED BY PFC WAYNE H. DELLINGER, TO ASSIST IN A BUNKER BUILDING PROGRAM.

DELLINGER, A MEMBER OF "ABLE" COMPANY, C&H ENGINEERS, DESIGNED THE CRUDE CONTRAPTION TO TRANSPORT EIGHT TO TEN INCH LOGS TO THE TOP OF "ITEM" COMPANY'S POSITIONS. THE TRAMWAY CONSISTS OF A PULLEY CONNECTED TO A LOG INSERTED INTO THE GROUND. ONE END OF THE ROPE USED IN THE OPERATION IS TIED TO A TRUCK DUMPER AND THE FREE END IS ATTACHED TO A MAXIMUM OF TWO LOGS.

"THE TRAMWAY IS CAPABLE OF HAULING ABOUT ONE THOUSAND POUNDS," SAID PFC DELLINGER, "AND IT SAVES A LOT OF MANUAL LABOR. LOGS EIGHT INCHES IN DIAMETER ARE JUST TOO BIG TO BE HAND CARRIED TO THE TOP OF HILLS THIS SIZE."

STEEL WAGE TALKS COLLAPSED YESTERDAY. PRESIDENTIAL ASSISTANT JOHN STEELMAN REPORTED THE QUESTION "COMPLETELY DEADLOCKED" AFTER FIVE DAYS OF TALKS.

THE DEADLOCK CAME ABOUT OVER THE UNION SHOP. UNDER A UNION SHOP, AN EMPLOYER CAN HIRE ANYONE HE WANTS BUT A WORKER MUST JOIN THE UNION AND PAY DUES.

CAPITAL NEWS

THE SENATE VOTED YESTERDAY MORNING TO GIVE OUR ALLIES SIX BILLION, 400 MILLION DOLLARS IN MILITARY AND ECONOMIC AID. IN DOING SO IT HAS VOTED DOWN AN AMENDMENT BY MISSOURI'S SENATOR KEM TO BAN ASSISTANCE TO WESTERN COUNTRIES TRADING WITH COMMUNIST COUNTRIES. ONLY THE PRESIDENT'S SIGNATURE IS NEEDED TO MAKE THE MEASURE A LAW. THE FINAL VERSION IS ABOUT A BILLION AND A HALF DOLLARS LESS THAN THE PRESIDENT HAD ASKED FOR.

THE BIGGEST REDUCTIONS WERE MADE IN ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE. THIS DOES NOT MEAN, HOWEVER, THAT THE MONEY IS NOT AVAILABLE FOR THIS PROGRAM. THE MEASURE PASSED YESTERDAY ONLY APPROVES THE MUTUAL SECURITY PROGRAM. IN EACH CASE, CONGRESS MUST FOLLOW UP THE AUTHORIZATION MEASURE WITH A SEPARATE BILL ACTUALLY APPROPRIATING THE MONEY.

THE SUPREME COURT IS EXPECTED TO DECIDE TODAY WHETHER IT WILL HEAR TWO SCHOOL SEGREGATION CASES. OPINIONS HANDED DOWN BY LOWER COURTS IN TOPEKA, KANSAS, AND CHARLESTOWN, NORTH CAROLINA, SAY THAT SEGREGATION OF RACES IN SCHOOLS IS FOR THE STATE LEGISLATURE, NOT THE COURTS, TO DECIDE.

THE SUPREME COURT'S DECISION ON WHETHER TO CONSIDER THE CASES WILL BE AN HISTORIC ONE.

HOUSE DEMOCRATIC LEADERS HAVE PROMISED TO PUT BEFORE THE HOUSE BY TODAY A BILL RENEWING THOSE WAR TIME EMERGENCY POWERS BELONGING TO PRESIDENT TRUMAN WHICH ARE DUE TO EXPIRE JUNE 15.

A BILL AUTHORIZING A ONE YEAR EXTENSION OF 48 OF MR. TRUMAN'S SO EMERGENCY POWERS HAS COMMITTEE APPROVAL.

TALBERT SUCCEEDED FRANK SHIELDS WHO CAPTAINED THE TEAM LAST YEAR AND WHO REFUSED RE-APPOINTMENT DUE TO PRIVATE BUSINESS.
