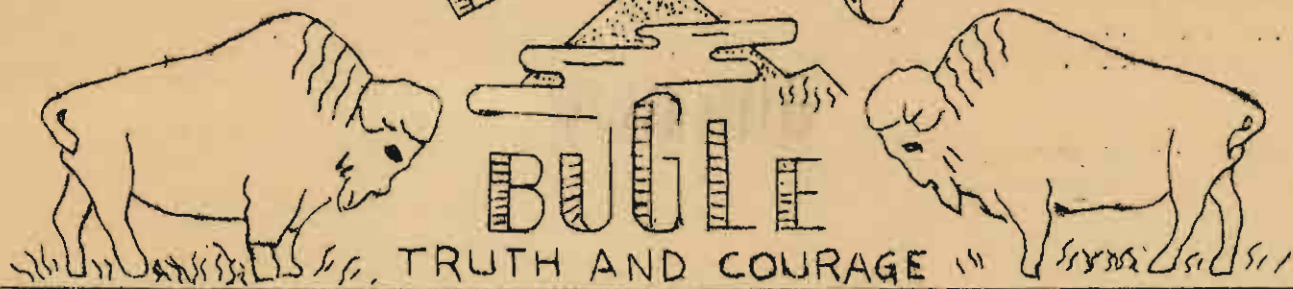

RED ASSIST

GETTING LOGS FOR BUILDING NEW BUNKERS WAS MADE AS EASY AS FALLING OFF A LOG FOR "ABLE" COMPANY OF THE 13TH ENGINEERS. THE ENGINEERS FOUND A WHOLE STOCKPILE OF LOGS LEFT BY THE CHINESE WHEN THEY EVACUATED THE AREA.

THE CHINESE LOG CAMP WAS HIDDEN IN A REMOTE VALLEY WHICH APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN ABANDONED IN A HURRY. SEVERAL BUNKERS WERE ALSO ERECTED BY THE CHINESE. THE STOCKPILE WAS DISCOVERED FROM AN OBSERVATION PLANE AND WHEN THE ENGINEERS FOUND OUT ABOUT IT THEY TOOK POSSESSION. FOUR HOURS OF WORK WITH THE BULLDOZER WAS ALL THAT WAS NEEDED TO PUT A ROAD TO THE LOG PILE.

M/SCT. JESSIE PENDLETON, FIRST SERGEANT OF "ABLE" COMPANY, SAID THE AREA LOOKED LIKE IT WAS ONCE A SERVICE COMPANY OCCUPIED BY THE ENEMY. HE ESTIMATED THAT THERE WERE ABOUT 1500 LOGS VARYING IN LENGTHS OF SEVEN AND 14 FEET AND IN DIAMETERS OF FOUR TO 14 INCHES.

THE DISCOVERY NOT ONLY SAVED THE ENGINEERS AT LEAST A MONTH OF LABOR, BUT ALSO OPENED A NEW SOURCE FOR FIRE TIMBER. THE PRESENT SOURCE HAS BEEN ALMOST EXHAUSTED FROM THE CURRENT BUNKER BUILDING PROGRAM.

THE LOGS WERE DIVIDED AMONG THE BATTALIONS EQUALLY. BY THE THIRD DAY MOST OF THE SUPPLY HAD BEEN HAULED AWAY TO THE FRONT LINE POSITIONS WHERE THE BUNKER BUILDING OPERATION IS ALMOST COMPLETED.

"THIS IS ONE TIME THE REDS GAVE US A HELPING HAND," CHUCKLED SERGEANT PENDLETON.

CRISIS IN BRITAIN

PRIME MINISTER CHURCHILL TOLD THE BRITISH PEOPLE YESTERDAY THEY WILL HAVE TO WAKE UP TO THE DANGER OF AN IMPENDING ECONOMIC CRISIS. HE SAID HE WAS SOUNDING MORE THAN ALERT. "IT IS AN ALARM," HE SAID.

"WE HAVE NEVER BEEN BEATEN YET. WE WILL FIGHT NOT FOR VAIN GLORY OR MATERIAL GAIN, BUT FOR OUR SURVIVAL AS AN INDEPENDENT SELF-SUPPORTING AND CONSEQUENTLY A SELF-RESPECTING NATION."

HE TOLD BRITAIN THAT THANKS TO UNPOPULAR MEASURES ADOPTED BY HIS GOVERNMENT IN THE PAST SIX MONTHS, "OUR HEAD IS ABOVE WATER" BUT IT IS NOT ENOUGH TO FLOAT, HE SAID. "WE HAVE TO SWIM AND SWIM SUCCESSFULLY, AND WE HAVE TO SWIM AGAINST THE STREAM."

DURING THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1952, BRITAIN AND HER STERLING BLOCK PARTNERS SPENT 635 MILLION MORE THAN THEY EARNED ABROAD.

ARMISTICE NEGOTIATIONS GOT UNDER WAY AS SCHEDULED AT 11 YESTERDAY MORNING WITH THE REDS SHOWING NO SIGNS OF GETTING DOWN TO BUSINESS.

DISPITE THE FACT THAT THE UN ARMISTICE DELEGATES CALLED A THREE DAY RECESS SATURDAY BECAUSE OF THE RED PROPAGANDA DRIBBLE, THE COMMUNISTS CONTINUED TO IGNORE THE ONE REMAINING ISSUE PREVENTING AN ARMISTICE, EXCHANGING PRISONERS OF WAR.

ON THE GROUND YESTERDAY, THE REDS UNLEASHED THEIR HEAVIEST ARTILLERY BARRAGE THIS YEAR. HOWEVER, UN SOLDIERS TURNED BACK RED CHINESE INFANTRYMEN TRYING TO ADVANCE UNDER COVER OF THE BARRAGE. THE REINFORCED ENEMY COMPANIES TRIED TO TAKE TWO ALLIED OUTPOSTS WEST OF CHORWON ON THE WESTERN FRONT.

SABRE JETS SHOT DOWN THREE COMMUNIST MIG'S IN THE AIR WAR YESTERDAY.

NEWS IN BRIEF

AN ARMY SURGEON SAYS 98 OUT OF 100 SOLDIERS WOUNDED IN KOREA SURVIVE. LT. COL. ROBERT HOLMES TOLD THE AMERICAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION CONVENTION IN CHICAGO THAT FURTHER DEATH RATE REDUCTIONS WILL COME FROM THE USE OF BODY ARMOR, BULLET AND SHELL PROOF VESTS. COLONEL HOLMES SAYS THE RESULTS OF EXTENSIVE FIELD TRIALS OF THE NEW SIX-POUND VEST OF COMPRESSED FIBER GLASS AND NYLON ARE ENCOURAGING.

PRESIDENT TRUMAN SAYS THE UNITED STATES WILL WELCOME ANY NEUTRAL INVESTIGATION OF PRISONERS OF WAR TREATMENTS ON KOJE ISLAND. THE PRESIDENT ENDORSED A SUGGESTION BY GEORGIA'S SENATOR RUSSEL TO INVITE MILITARY EXPERTS FROM SWEDEN, SWITZERLAND, INDIA, PAKISTAN AND INDONESIA TO VOUCH FOR THE WAY PRISONERS ARE CARED FOR ON KOJE.

SECRETARY OF STATE DEAN ACHESON SAYS THE PRESIDENT'S POWERS TO SEND TROOPS ABROAD WILL NOT BE INCREASED BY THE WEST GERMAN PEACE CONTRACTS. HOWEVER, HE TOLD THE SENATE FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE THAT HE BELIEVES THE PRESIDENT HAS THE POWER TO SEND TROOPS ANYWHERE IF IT WOULD ADVANCE THE SECURITY OF THE UNITED STATES.

THE SENATE IS STICKING BY ITS STAND THAT PRESIDENT TRUMAN SHOULD USE THE TAFT-HARTLEY ACT IN THE STEEL CRISIS. YESTERDAY MORNING THE UPPER CHAMBER REJECTED ANOTHER MOVE TO GIVE THE PRESIDENT THE PLANT SEIZURE POWERS HE ASKED FOR. OREGON SENATOR MORSE OFFERED THE SEIZURE PROPOSAL. IT WAS SLAPPED DOWN 53-26.

THE MAGAZINE "IRON AGE" REPORTS THAT THE STRIKE HAS COST THE UNITED STATES SOME SIX MILLION TONS OF STEEL. THE MAGAZINE SAYS THE CHIEF STUMBLING BLOCK TO AN AGREEMENT IS THE UNION'S INSISTENCE ON A CLOSED SHOP.
