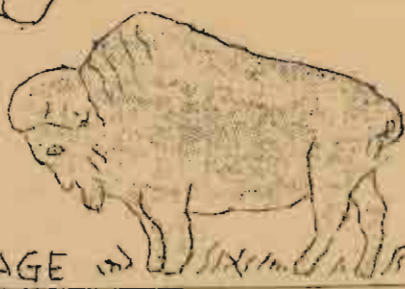

SWEET POTATO BLUES

"SWEET POTATOES" HAVE BECOME POPULAR WITH THE "BUFFALOES" ON THE FRONT LINES. HOWEVER, THESE SWEET POTATOES DON'T RELIEVE THE PAINS OF HUNGER--THEY ARE MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS, BETTER KNOWN AS OCARINAS.

THE SMALL FLUTE-LIKE INSTRUMENT HAS BEEN TAKEN UP WITH FEVERISH ENTHUSIASM ON THE PART OF SOME "BUFFALOES" WHO WERE FORTUNATE ENOUGH TO RECEIVE THEM THROUGH THE RECENT DISTRIBUTION PUT OUT BY SPECIAL SERVICES.

THE SWEET POTATOES WERE SHIPPED, NOT IN SACKS, BUT IN BOXES WITH FOUR TO A SET TO SPECIAL SERVICES. IN THE SET, ONE OCARINA IS IN THE KEY OF "C" AND THE OTHER THREE IN THE KEY OF "G." THESE SETS WERE DISTRIBUTED TO THE THREE BATTALIONS EQUALLY. IN TURN, THEY WERE GIVEN TO MEN WHO WERE MUSICALLY INCLINED. AN INSTRUCTION BOOK WAS PROVIDED WITH EACH SET TO SIMPLIFY THE LEARNING AND TO GIVE LISTENERS A BREAK FROM TOO MUCH SUFFERING FROM DEAFENING PRACTICE SESSIONS.--W.L.

NEW K-VET PROPOSAL

A SENATE ARMED SERVICES SUBCOMMITTEE YESTERDAY APPROVED A BILL TO PREVENT KOREAN COMBAT VETERANS FROM HAVING TO SERVE A SECOND HITCH IN THE ARMED FORCES IN THE EVENT OF A SIMILAR EMERGENCY.

LOUISIANA SENATOR RUSSEL LONG SAID THE BILL PROPOSES THAT THOSE ROTATED FROM KOREA AND DISCHARGED SHOULD NOT BE RECALLED SHORT OF A DECLARATION OF WAR BY CONGRESS AND AS LONG AS QUALIFIED RESERVES ARE AVAILABLE.

THE WHITE HOUSE REMAINED SILENT YESTERDAY ON PRESIDENTIAL PLANS FOR ENDING THE STEEL STRIKE.

NOW THAT CONGRESS HAS TOLD THE PRESIDENT THEY WILL NOT GIVE HIM THE RIGHT TO SEIZE THE STEEL MILLS, MR. TRUMAN MAY BE FORCED TO USE THE TAFT-HARTLEY ACT, THE LAW HE DISLIKES SO MUCH.

TWO OF KOJE ISLAND'S TOUGHEST PRISONER COMPOUNDS YESTERDAY OBEYED TO ALLIED TRANSFER ORDERS.

ABOUT 3300 NORTH KOREAN PRISONERS MOVED OUT OF COMPOUND 66 TO SMALLER 500-MAN COMPOUNDS WHERE THEY CAN BE CONTROLLED BETTER. AN HOUR EARLIER, 200 NORTH KOREAN PRISONERS SUSPECTED OF WAR CRIMES WERE MARCHED WITHOUT INCIDENT TO DIFFERENT COMPOUNDS ABOUT 100 YARDS AWAY.

SOVIET GUARDS AROUND WEST BERLIN YESTERDAY WERE TOLD TO SHOOT TO KILL. THE REDS ARE EXTENDING THEIR SECURITY MEASURES TO INCLUDE THE BORDER BETWEEN EAST AND WEST BERLIN IN ORDER TO KEEP THE POPULATION OF EAST GERMANY FROM MAKING A MASS EXIT TO THE FREEDOM OF THE WEST.

THE HOUSE PASSED YESTERDAY THE TWO BILLION, 750 MILLION DOLLAR MILITARY CONSTRUCTION BILL FOR 273 ARMY, NAVY AND AIR FORCE BASE PROJECTS AT HOME AND ABROAD.

ARMISTICE NEGOTIATORS MET YESTERDAY MORNING FOR 10 MINUTES. NO PROGRESS WAS REPORTED.

HEADLINE NEWS

THE NAVY PLANS TO LAY THE KEEL OF ITS FIRST ATOMIC POWERED SUBMARINE TONIGHT. PRESIDENT TRUMAN WILL BE ON HAND TO AUTOGRAPH THE HULL PLATE OF THE 40 MILLION DOLLAR USS NAUTILUS.

MUCH REMAINS TO BE DONE BEFORE THE NAUTILUS WILL TAKE ITS PLACE IN THE NATIONS FIGHTING FORCES. ONLY THE SHELL WILL BE BUILT AT GROTON, CONNECTICUT. IT IS EXPECTED THAT THE POWER PLANT INSTALLATION AND LAUNCHING OF THE SHIP WILL TAKE TWO YEARS.

THE RUSSIANS HAVE REJECTED AN AMERICAN PROTEST AGAINST THE SHOOTING OF AN AMERICAN MP IN GERMANY.

THE SOVIETS CHARGED THE MP WITH VIOLATING SOVIET ZONE TERRITORY AND CLAIMED THAT AN EAST GERMAN POLICEMAN "FIRED INTO THE AIR" TO STOP THE MP. THE REDS DID NOT EXPLAIN, HOWEVER, HOW THE AMERICAN WAS WOUNDED.

TANK SUPPORTED ALLIED SOLDIERS HAVE CAPTURED AN IMPORTANT HILL MASS WEST OF CHORWON AFTER A VICIOUS DAWN TO DUSK BATTLE.

GROUND ACTION SLOWED UP THURSDAY NIGHT, BUT ARTILLERY CONTINUED TO POUND AWAY AT THE ENEMY.

CAPTURE OF THE WESTERN FRONT HILL MASS CLIMAXED THE MOST SEVERE FIGHTING IN THE LAST SIX MONTHS. EIGHTH ARMY HEADQUARTERS DID NOT IMMEDIATELY ESTIMATE THE SIZE OF THE CHINESE FORCE OR CASUALTIES IN THE BATTLE.

THE HILL MASS IS NEAR TWO OTHER ADVANCED POSITIONS THE CHINESE HAVE ATTACKED ALL WEEK.

Extend Powers For 15 Days

CONGRESS YETTERDAY VOTED TO EXTEND PRESIDENT TRUMAN'S WAR POWERS ANOTHER 15 DAYS. THIS WAS DONE SO THE LAW MAKERS WOULD HAVE ENOUGH TIME TO COMPLETE A BILL EXTENDING THE PRESIDENT'S POWERS ANOTHER YEAR.
