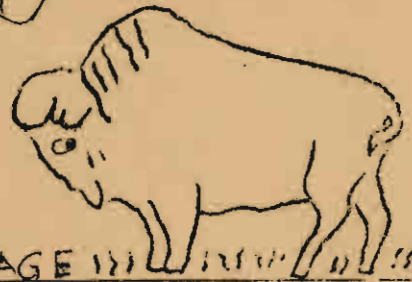
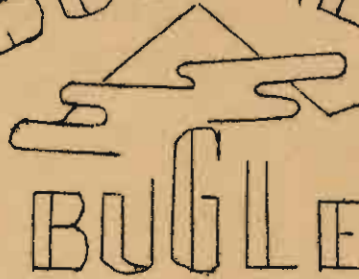
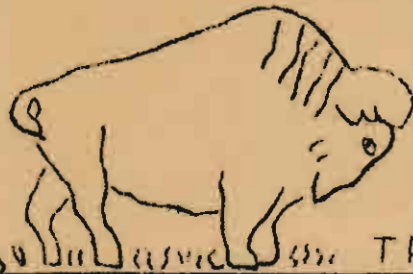

## PIN POINT ARTILLERY AIDS RECON PATROL

CLOSE COOPERATION BETWEEN THE INFANTRY AND FIELD ARTILLERY WAS DEMONSTRATED RECENTLY IN THE "BUFFALO" REGIMENT SECTOR OF THE KOREAN FRONT. THE ACTION OCCURRED WHEN A RECONNAISSANCE PATROL BECAME PINNED DOWN BY ENEMY AUTOMATIC WEAPON AND MORTAR FIRE. ACCURATE AND TIMELY FIRE WAS DIRECTED BY THE 49TH FIELD ARTILLERY BATTALION ON ENEMY POSITIONS ENABLING THE FRIENDLY GROUND TROOPS TO WITHDRAW.

1ST LT WILLIAM A. JACKSON, THIRD PLATOON LEADER OF "LOVE" COMPANY IN CHARGE OF THE PATROL MOVED OUT WITH HIS SIX MEN TO PERFORM THEIR DAYLIGHT MISSION. THEY ESTABLISHED THEIR POSITION BUT AFTER A THROUGH INVESTIGATION COULD NOT SPOT ANY ENEMY MOVEMENTS.

TO FURTHER THEIR SEARCH FOR INFORMATION ABOUT THE ENEMY THE PATROL MOVED UP A HILL. THEY SPOTTED A COMMUNICATION TRENCH LOCATED ON A NEARBY SLOPE AND HEADED FOR IT.

PFC STANLEY GRIFFITHS, THE POINT-MAN, GOT TO WITHIN 20 YARDS OF THE TRENCH WHEN TWO ENEMY POPPED OUT OF THE POSITION AND FIRED WITH BURP GUNS. THE PATROL TOOK COVER AND A 15 MINUTE FIRE FIGHT FOLLOWED. BECAUSE IT WAS A RECONNAISSANCE PATROL THEY DID NOT HAVE A SUFFICIENT SUPPLY OF AMMUNITION TO CONTINUING AN EFFECTIVE FIGHT. HOWEVER, EFFECTIVE FIRING BY PFC BILL GALLAGHER KEPT THE ENEMY DOWN SO THAT THEY COULD NOT BRING IN EFFECTIVE FIRE.

"WHEN GRIFFITHS HIT THE DIRT, I THOUGHT THAT HE HAD BEEN HIT," SAID LEUTENANT JACKSON. "WE CALLED TO HIM BUT HE DIDN'T ANSWER," HE FURTHER STATED.

DURING THE FIRE FIGHT, SFC GERALD LANGAN, PLATOON SERGEANT, DECIDED TO CRAWL UP TO THE SPOT GRIFFITHS HAD FALLEN TO DETERMINE THE EXTENT OF HIS INJURIES AND RETURN HIM TO SAFE GROUND. HOWEVER, ENEMY FIRE KEPT HIM FROM DOING THIS AT THE MOMENT. (CONT'D PAGE 2)

## LATE NEWS HI-LITES

ARMISTICE NEGOTIATORS LOOKED HORNS AGAIN YESTERDAY MORNING FOR 22 MINUTES. NO PROGRESS WAS REPORTED. ANOTHER MEETING HAS BEEN SCHEDULED FOR THIS MORNING AT THE COMMUNIST'S REQUEST.

AN AMMUNITION DUMP BLEW UP YESTERDAY MORNING NEAR PUSAN. FIRE ENGINES SCREAMED THROUGH THE STREETS OF THE PROVISIONAL SOUTH KOREAN CAPITAL TO THE SCENE OF EXPLOSION 15 MILES AWAY. ARMY INVESTIGATORS ARE LOOKING INTO THE POSSIBILITIES OF SABOTAGE.

THE AIR FORCE HAS TOLD CONGRESS THAT RUSSIA MAY HAVE WORLD-WIDE AIR SUPERIORITY BY 1954. ACTING AIR FORCES CHIEF OF STAFF GENERAL NATHAN TWINING TOLD THE SENATE MILITARY APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE THAT RUSSIAN AIR STRENGTH IN TWO YEARS MAY BE TWO OR THREE TIMES THE SIZE OF THE US AIR FORCE.

AMBASSADOR CHESTER BOWLES SAID TODAY ASIA WILL BE DOOMED AND EUROPE SHAKEN TO ITS FOUNDATION IF INDIA FALLS TO COMMUNISM. THE US AMBASSADOR TO INDIA SAID INDIA NEEDS 240 MILLION DOLLARS A YEAR FOR THE NEXT THREE OR FOUR YEARS TO COME OUT ON TOP IN THE STRUGGLE AGAINST DISEASE, HUNGER AND COMMUNISM.

VICE PRESIDENT ALBEN BARKLEY PREDICTED YESTERDAY FOREIGN POLICY WOULD BE THE MAJOR PRESIDENTIAL CAMPAIGN ISSUE. BARKLEY SAID THE REPUBLICANS MAY TRY TO PUT THE SPOTLIGHT ON CORRUPTION IN GOVERNMENT, BUT HE SAID "I DOUBT IF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE ARE GOING TO BE SWAYED THAT 100TH OF ONE PERCENT OF MEN IN PUBLIC LIFE HAVE BEEN DERELICT IN THEIR DUTIES."

DEMOCRATIC HEADQUARTERS IN WASHINGTON SAYS W. AVERILL HARRISMAN WILL GET EIGHT OF UTAH'S 12 DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION VOTES.

WORLD NEWS

THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND HAS ACCUSED THE COMMUNISTS OF ENDANGERING THE LIVES OF AMERICAN AND OTHER ALLIED NATIONALS HELD IN NORTH KOREAN PRISON CAMPS.

IN A FORMAL NOTE HANDED TO THE COMMUNIST ARMISTICE DELEGATION SUNDAY, THE ALLIES CHARGE THAT THE REDS HAVE FAILED TO MARK FIVE POW CAMPS SO THAT UN PLANNED STRIKES MAY BE SURE OF AVOIDING THEM IN THEIR DAILY STRIKES AGAINST COMMUNIST TARGETS.

THE REDS HAVE INDICATED THEY ARE AFRAID OF AN INSPECTION OF ALLIED POW CAMPS BY REPRESENTATIVES OF NEUTRAL NATIONS. COMMUNIST ARMISTICE NEGOTIATORS HAVE TOLD THE UN COMMAND THEY WILL REGARD ANY NEUTRAL NATION INSPECTING ALLIED CAMPS AS NO LONGER NEUTRAL.

PRESIDENT TRUMAN HAS SUGGESTED THAT REPRESENTATIVES FROM SWEDEN, SWITZERLAND, INDIA, PAKISTAN AND INDONESIA VISIT THE CAMPS TO TESTIFY THAT THE UN COMMAND IS TREATING THEIR PRISONERS WELL.

IN GROUND FIGHTING SUNDAY, THE COMMUNISTS UNLEASHED WHAT APPEARED TO BE THEIR HEAVIEST MORTAR AND ARTILLERY BARRAGE OF THE WAR.

THE COMMUNISTS THREW A TOTAL OF 11,703 ROUNDS OF MORTAR AND ARTILLERY FIRE AT ALLIED POSITIONS, MOSTLY ON THE CENTRAL FRONT.

AN EIGHTH ARMY BRIEFING OFFICER SAID THIS WAS PROBABLY THE HIGHEST TOTAL FIRED BY THE ENEMY IN ANY SINGLE DAY SINCE THE START OF THE WAR.

EAST GERMAN REFUGEES SAY FIGHTING IS RAGING ALONG THE 600-MILE EAST-WEST GERMAN BORDER AS SOVIET ZONE RESIDENTS OPENLY RESISTED FORCED EVACUATION FROM THE EAST GERMAN ZONE. REPORTS SAY RESISTANCE SPREAD THROUGH LOCAL OFFICIALS, SOME OF THEM COMMUNISTS, WHO REFUSED TO FOLLOW ORDERS FROM BERLIN AND REFUSED TO PUSH THE EVACUATION.

USING THE RADIO LT JACKSON CALLED FOR ARTILLERY SUPPORT. IN LESS THAN FIVE MINUTES ARTILLERY CAME IN ON THE ENEMY ENABLING LANGAN TO CRAWL FORWARD. IN THE MEANTIME GRIFFITHS WHO WAS NOT WOUNDED AT ALL, DECIDED TO CRAWL BACK TO THE REST OF THE PATROL BY GOING AROUND TO THE LEFT. LANGAN, WHEN HE REACHED THE FORWARD POSITION SAW WHAT GRIFFITHS WAS DOING. "LET'S GET THE HECK OUT OF HERE!" SHOUTED LANGAN AND THE TWO MEN RETURNED BY THEIR OWN SEPARATE ROUTES.

WHEN THEIR SECOND VOLLEY OF ARTILLERY CAME IN, THE PATROL WAS ABLE TO WITHDRAW AND RETURN TO BASE WITHOUT A SINGLE CASUALTY.

"IT WAS THE BEST ARTILLERY SUPPORT I HAVE EVER WITNESSED. IT WAS RIGHT ON THE BUTT!" EXCLAIMED LT JACKSON.
