## BUFFALOES OPEN SEASON WITH WIN

THE "BUFFALOES" OPENED THEIR BASEBALL SEASON OFFICIALLY YESTERDAY, DEFEATING THE 32ND "BUCCANEERS", 5-2.

IT WAS A GALA OCCASION FOR THE 17TH WITH COL RICHARD A. RISEN THROWING IN THE BALL TO START THE GAME. DECKED IN THEIR NEW BLUE UNIFORMS, THE "BUFFALOES" DISPLAYED AN EXTREME AMOUNT OF POWER BEHIND THE BAT AS WELL AS ON THE MOUND.

PFC JACK PARSLEY ASSUMED THE PITCHING DUTIES FOR THE "BUFFALOES" BUT DEVELOPED A SORE ARM AFTER PITCHING TO THE FIRST FOUR HITTERS. HE WAS RELIEVED BY THE VERY CAPABLE CPL TED PONIEWSKI, WHO HURLED THE REMAINDER OF THE GAME, STRIKING OUT 19 BATTERS AND ALLOWING BUT ONE HIT.

THE FIRST BLOOD WAS DRAWN BY THE 17TH WHEN CPL MILTON GAUDET BELTED A 320 FOOT HOMER IN THE SECOND INNING. THERE WAS NO FURTHER SCORE UNTIL THE TOP OF THE FIFTH WHEN TWO "BUFFALO" MISQUES ALLOWED THE "BUCCANEERS" TO PUSH ACROSS TWO RUNS.

PONIEWSKI HELPED HIS OWN CAUSE IN THE SIXTH, POUNDING OUT A TWO-RUN DOUBLE OFF THE 32ND'S VASCO. THE "BUFFALOES" SCORED AGAIN IN THE SEVENTH AND EIGHTH INNINGS ON THREE HITS.

CPL PONIEWSKI HURLED HITLESS BALL EIGHT FULL INNINGS BEFORE OPPOSING DITCHER ROSE BEAT OUT AN INFIELD GROUND BALL. PONIEWSKI COUNTERED BY STRIKING OUT THE NEXT TWO BATTERS TO END THE GAME.

## WORLD NEWS

THE GOVERNMENT IS GETTING READY FOR A TAG PROMISED MOVE TO GET MORE STEEL FOR DEFENSE PLANTS. THE NATIONAL PRODUCTION ADMINISTRATION HAS GIVEN THE DEFENSE DEPT THE FIRST CLAIM ON VITAL MACHINERY PARTS CONTAINING STEEL. IT ALSO GRANTED THE ARMED FORCES AUTHORITY TO DEMAND ALL STEEL NOW BEING TURNED OUT BY THE FEW MILLS THAT AGEN'T STRIKE SOUND.

MEANWHILE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES IS GETTING READY TO TAKE UP THE DEFENSE PRODUCTION BILL. THIS WILL HIT THE HOUSE FLOOR TOMORROW.

CONGRESS HAS BEEN TOLD HOW MUCH THE GERMAN REARMAMENT PROJECT WILL COST. U.S. HIGH COMMISSIONER JOHN J. MCCLOY, TESTIFYING BEFORE THE SENATE FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE, PUT THE FIGURE AT SEVEN BILLION DOLLARS FOR THE NEXT THREE YEARS. THE U.S. WILL HELP PAY THE BILL WITH DEFENSE SUPPORT FUNDS AND SOME MILITARY EQUIPMENT.

FIRE FIGHTERS HAVE BROUGHT UNDER CONTROL THE FIRES AND EXPLOSIONS THAT ERUPTED MONDAY AT AN EIGHTH ARMY AMMUNITION DEPOT 15 MILES FROM PUSAN. ARMY OFFICIALS SAY THAT ONLY TWO FIRES WERE SMOLDERING AS OF SEVEN YESTERDAY MORNING AND EXPLOSIONS ARE TAKING PLACE ONLY AT INFREQUENT INTERVALS. THE UNITED NATIONS CIVIL ASSISTANCE COMMAND IS SUPPLYING FOOD FOR BETWEEN 20,000 AND 30,000 PERSONS WHO WERE EVACUATED FROM HOMES NEAR THE DEPOT AREA.

UNITED NATIONS ARMISTICE DELEGATES WALKED OUT OF THE TRUCE NEGOTIATIONS AGAIN YESTERDAY. TUESDAY'S MEETING LASTED JUST 32 MINUTES.

MAJ GEN WILLIAM K. HARRISON SAID WE HAVE RECESSED UNTIL JUNE 21.

HEADLINE NEWS

RUSSIA HAS AGREED TO RETURN 186 NAVAL SHIPS WHICH THE UNITED STATES LEND LEASED TO THE SOVIETS DURING WORLD WAR II. THE STATE DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN TRYING TO GET THE SHIPS BACK FOR FOUR YEARS. EACH TIME THE REDS HAVE OFFERED TO SETTLE THEIR 11 BILLION DOLLAR LEND LEASE ACCOUNT FOR 300 MILLION DOLLARS AND EACH TIME THE UNITED STATES HAS TURNED IT DOWN.

AN UNARMED SWEDISH FLYING BOAT WAS FIRED UPON BY TWO SOVIET MIG FIGHTERS OVER THE BALTIC SEA YESTERDAY AND CRASH LANDED IN THE WATER WHILE TRYING TO GET BACK TO BASE. ALL SEVEN CREWMEN ON BOARD WERE RESCUED BY A GERMAN SHIP.

SWEDISH PREMIER TAGE ERLANDER PERSONALLY HANDED A PROTEST TO THE SOVIET AMBASSADOR AFTER AN EMERGENCY CABINET MEETING.

THE NEW NATO COMMANDER HAS ARRIVED AT ROME TO MEET ITALIAN DEFENSE OFFICIALS. GENERAL MATTHEW B. RIDGWAY LANDED AT AN AIRPORT OUTSIDE THE CITY AS 50,000 TROOPS AND POLICE MOBILIZED TO PREVENT COMMUNIST VIOLENCE. CRACK FEDERAL POLICE LINED THE RUNWAY WHERE THE PLANE LANDED. THE ENTIRE 12 MILE ROUTE TO ROME WAS ALSO LINED WITH TROOPS AND POLICE.

AN ENGINEER'S STRIKE HAS SHUT DOWN THE LONG ISLAND RAILROAD STRANDING 150,000 COMMUTERS IN THE NEW YORK AREA. TRAFFIC WAS JAMMED BUMPER TO BUMPER ON THE BIG PARKWAYS LEADING INTO THE CITY AFTER MEMBERS OF THE BROTHERHOOD OF LOCOMOTIVE ENGINEERS STRUCK THE NATION'S BIGGEST COMMUTER RAILROAD. ALL AVAILABLE BUSES WERE PRESSED INTO SERVICE.

MANY COMMUTERS, TAKING A LOOK AT THE CROWDED HIGHWAYS, SIMPLY TURNED AROUND AND WENT HOME WITHOUT TRYING TO GET TO THEIR JOBS IN NEW YORK CITY.
