PRESIDENT TRUMAN INDICATES HE MAY USE THE TAFT HARTLEY LAW TO END THE CRIPPLING STEEL STRIKE. THE PRESIDENT SAID THE INJUNCTION PROVISION OF THE LABOR LAW IS PER-
