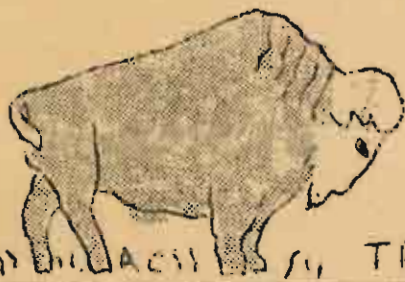

DIVISION C.G. AWARDS SILVER STARS

AN IMPRESSIVE CEREMONY AT 1600 HOURS THURSDAY HONORED THE BUFFALOES WITH PRESENTATION OF THE AWARD OF THE SILVER STAR MEDAL TO SEVEN MEMBERS OF KING COMPANY FOR GALLANTRY IN RECENT FRONT LINE ACTION.

MAJ GEN L.L. LEMNITZER, COMMANDING GENERAL OF THE 7TH INFANTRY DIVISION, MADE THE MEDAL PRESENTATION, AND SPOKE BRIEFLY TO AN ASSEMBLY OF THE 3RD BATTALION, REGIMENTAL COMMANDER COL RICHARD A. BISTEN WAS IN THE PRESENTATION PARTY.

RECEIVING THE PRIZED AWARDS WERE CPL LUVERNE C. PRESCOTT, CPL KENNETH M. RICHTER, PFC RAYFORD ASHFORD, PFC SONNY B. SIMPSON, PFC WINFORD BOOTH, SGT ROBERT N. RUDD, AND CPL FRED B. MOGEE. CPL WILBERT W. PARKER, EVACUATED, WAS NOT PRESENT FOR HIS AWARD.

ACCOUNTS OF THE GALLANT ACTIONS FOR WHICH THE AWARDS WERE MADE WERE RECOUNTED FROM CITATIONS BY CAPT GALEN C. MOREY, REGIMENTAL ADJUTANT.

AFTER REVIEW OF THE COLORS AND PRESENTATION OF THE AWARDS, GENERAL LEMNITZER STEPPED TO THE MICROPHONE AND SAID: "IT IS AN HONOR AND A PRIVILEGE FOR ME TO BE HERE TODAY TO PRESENT THESE AWARDS.

"DO NOT THINK," HE CONTINUED, "THAT THESE SEVEN AWARDS PRESENTED HERE TODAY WILL, NECESSARILY, BE THE ONLY AWARDS TO COME OUT OF THIS ACTION. AFTER A REVIEW OF PERTINENT INFORMATION ON THIS ACTION, QUITE PROBABLY FURTHER AWARDS WILL BE MADE.

"MAKING AWARDS NOW, SO SOON AFTER THE ACTION, IS THE RESULT OF A POLICY I ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AWARDS AS PROMPTLY AS POSSIBLE, SO THAT THE MEN MAY BE AWARDED MEDALS IN THE PRESENCE OF THEIR FRIENDS AND COMRADES," HE SAID.

FOLLOWING THIS GENERAL LEMNITZER POSED FOR PICTURES WITH THE MEN RECEIVING AWARDS, AND PERSONALLY CONGRATULATED EACH ONE.

News Briefs

A BILL GIVING THE MARINE CORPS A GREATER VOICE IN MILITARY POLICY IS NOW ON PRESIDENT TRUMAN'S DESK. CONGRESS COMPLETED ACTION ON THE MEASURE THURSDAY AFTER ALSO AUTHORIZING THE CORPS TO DOUBLE ITS SIZE FROM 200 TO 400 THOUSAND MEN. THE BILL JUST PASSED PERMITS THE MARINE COMMANDANT TO FIT IN WITH THE JOINT CHIEFS AS CO-EQUAL ON MATTERS AFFECTING THE MARINES.

THE FORMER CHIEF ALLIED ARMISTICE NEGOTIATOR SAYS THE REDS ARE USING THE PANMUNJOM NEGOTIATIONS AS A "TACTICAL MANUEVER TO BUILD UP THEIR ARMY." VICE ADM C. TURNER JOY ACCUSES THE COMMUNISTS OF FAILING TO SHOW GOOD FAITH IN THE TALKS AND ADDED THEY HAVE SHOWN NO INCLINATION TO COMPROMISE ON THE UNSETTLED PROBLEM OF PRISONER OF WAR REPATRIATION.

MAY USE T-H LAW

PRESIDENT TRUMAN INDICATES HE MAY USE THE TAFT-HARTLEY LAW TO END THE CRIPPLING STEEL STRIKE. THE PRESIDENT SAID THE INJUNCTION PROVISION OF THE LABOR LAW IS PERMISSIVE, BUT NOT MANDATORY.

IN HIS WEEKLY NEWS CONFERENCE MR. TRUMAN SAYS IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO CUT TAXES. BOTH GENERAL EISENHOWER AND SENATOR TAFT HAVE STATED THEY WOULD REDUCE TAXES IF ELECTED.

PRESIDENT TRUMAN HAS ASKED CONGRESS FOR SPECIAL LEGISLATION ENABLING A MILLION SERVICEMEN TO VOTE IN THE FALL ELECTION. THE PROPOSED BILL WOULD OVERCOME SOLDIER VOTING PROVISIONS THAT STILL EXIST IN SOME STATES.

A REMINDER

SWEDEN HAS SERVED WRITTEN NOTICE THAT SWEDISH SHIPS AND PLANES WILL SHOOT BACK IF ATTACKED. THE SWEDISH DEFENSE STAFF ALSO SPIKED A REPORT THAT ALL SWEDISH SHIPS AND PLANES HAVE BEEN PULLED BACK FROM THE EASTERN BALTIC BECAUSE SOVIET JET FIGHTERS SHOT DOWN AN UNARMED SWEDISH PLANE THIS WEEK.

MEANTIME, A CONSERVATIVE PAPER IN STOCKHOLM REPORTED THAT RUSSIA HAS TRANSFORMED BALTIC ISLANDS INTO MAJOR BASES FOR GUIDED MISSILES TRAINED ON TARGETS IN SWEDEN, NORWAY AND DENMARK.
