CENTRAL FRONT ACTION—PREDICT K-V ACTION

IN A SIX HOUR BATTLE YESTERDAY MORNING, ALLIED TROOPS KILLED OR WOUNDED AN ESTIMATED 500 CHINESE COMMUNISTS. IT WAS THE 21ST ATTEMPT BY THE REDS TO TAKE BACK THE POSITIONS THEY LOST 10 DAYS AGO NEAR CHORWON. THIS TIME THE CHINESE MOVED IN BEHIND A MASSIVE ARTILLERY BARRAGE WHICH AT ONE POINT POURED 60 SHELLS A MINUTE ON ALLIED POSITIONS.

THE FIRST RED DRIVE WAS DRIVEN OFF BY ALLIED ARTILLERY, BUT THE REDS REGROUPED AND HIT AGAIN. UN INFEANTRYMEN ROSE FROM THEIR FOXHOLES AND MET THE REDS WITH HAND GRENADES AND BAYONETS. THE REDS WITHDREW SHORTLY AFTERWARDS WHEN ALLIED REINFORCEMENTS ARRIVED.

THE PLENARY SESSION OF FULL DELEGATIONS ON ARMISTICE TALKS ENDED AT 11:30 YESTERDAY MORNING. ANOTHER MEETING HAS BEEN SCHEDULED FOR TODAY AT THE COMMUNISTS REQUEST.

NO PROGRESS WAS REPORTED FROM YESTERDAY'S MEETING.

THE STATE DEPARTMENT HAS ORDERED CUSTOMS OFFICIALS NOT TO ALLOW OWEN LATTIMORE TO LEAVE THE COUNTRY. THE ORDER CAME AFTER THE DEPARTMENT RECEIVED WHAT IT CALLED "OFFICIAL ALLEGATION" FROM AN UNNAMED GOVERNMENT AGENCY THAT LATTIMORE WAS PLANNING TO VISIT RUSSIA.

THE ORDER AND THE ALERT OF CUSTOMS OFFICIALS CAME JUNE 3. AT THE TIME, LATTIMORE TERMED THE WHOLE AFFAIR "A MID-SUMMER NIGHT'S MADNESS." HE SAID HE HAD NO PLANS TO GO ABROAD AND THAT HE HAD NOT SOUGHT A PASSPORT. THE DEPARTMENT SAID THE ACTION WAS TAKEN UNDER ITS MAY 1ST BAN AGAINST TRAVEL TO RUSSIA AND ITS SATELLITES.

SENATOR LESTER HILL OF ALABAMA PREDICTS QUICK ACTION BY A SENATE LABOR COMMITTEE ON A NEW GI BILL OF RIGHTS. THE MEASURE IS DESIGNED TO GIVE KOREAN WAR VETERANS ABOUT THE SAME EDUCATIONAL TRAINING AND LOAN BENEFITS AS THOSE BY SERVICEMEN WHO FOUGHT IN WORLD WAR II.

A BILL DESIGNED TO ASSURE EVERYONE IN THE ARMED FORCES A CHANCE TO VOTE IS UP BEFORE THE SENATE. PRESIDENT TRUMAN HAS URGED CONGRESS TO PASS SUCH LEGISLATION PROMPTLY.

THE PRESIDENT SAID THE BILL WOULD GUARANTEE THAT ALMOST A MILLION MEN AND WOMEN IN UNIFORM COULD VOTE IN NOVEMBER. SENATE SPONSORS OF THE BILL SAY IT IS NEEDED BECAUSE ABSENTEE VOTING IN MORE THAN HALF OF THE STATES IS INADEQUATE.

THE MARINE CORPS IS SETTING UP ITS FIRST PERMANENT AMPHIBIOUS TRAINING TEAM IN JAPAN.

AN ANNOUNCEMENT FROM WASHINGTON SAYS BRIG GEN WILLIAM DAVIES IS ON ROUTE TO JAPAN TO BECOME CHIEF OF THE UNIT. HE FORMALLY COMMANDED THE TROOPS TRAINING UNIT AT CORONADO, CALIFORNIA.

THE ANNOUNCEMENT SAYS A TEAM SIMILAR TO THE ONE TO BE ESTABLISHED HELPED THE ARMY TRAIN AMPHIBIOUS UNITS IN 1950. THESE UNITS LATER WORKED WITH THE MARINES AT THE BIG LANDING AT INCHON IN SEPTEMBER, 1950.

THE HOUSE HAS VOTED TENTATIVELY TO JUST ABOUT KILL ALL PRICE CONTROLS. BY A VOTE OF 146 TO 89, THE HOUSE DECIDED THERE SHOULD BE NO PRICE CONTROLS ON ITEMS WHICH ARE NOT RATIONED OR ALLOCATED. AT PRESENT NO GOODS ARE RATIONED AND ONLY A FEW METALS ARE BEING ALLOCATED. CONTROLS ON EVEN THESE ITEMS MIGHT ALSO BE REMOVED BY THE HOUSE ACTION.

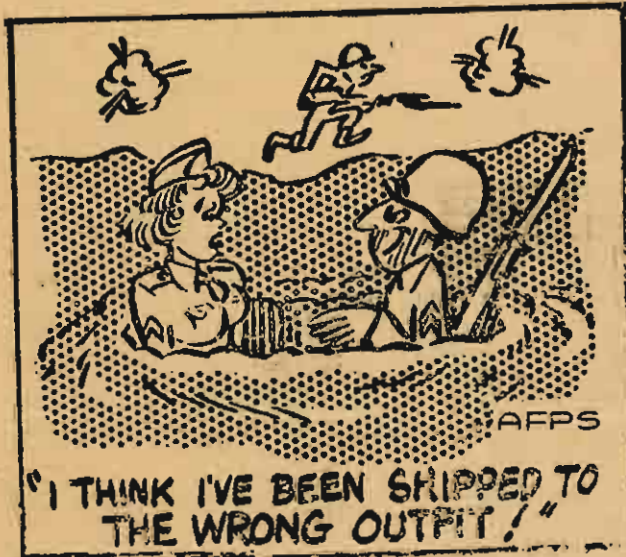
