### MANSION ON THE HILL

COMFORT LOVING AMERICANS ARE WELL KNOWN FOR LETTING LITTLE TIME ELAPSE IN A BIVOUAC UNTIL THEY MAKE IMPROVEMENTS TO SATISFY THEIR LIVING TASTES. AN EXCELLENT EXAMPLE OF THIS FACT IS THE STORY OF M/SGT VICTOR ADAIR AND 1ST/SGT JESSIE PENDLETON, ABLE COMPANY, 13TH ENGINEER COMBAT BATTALION.

ADAIR AND PENDLETON WERE LIVING IN PUP TENTS NEAR THE FRONT LINES IN KOREA, QUARTERS TO THEIR DISCOMFORT. SO, UTILIZING SPARE TIME AND A REMARKABLE ABILITY TO SCROUNGE NON-SALVAGABLE MATERIALS, THEY SET ABOUT TO BUILD THEMSELVES A HOME.

"MANSION ON THE HILL" NOW STANDS AS A TRIBUTE TO THEIR EFFORTS. THE FOURTEEN BY TWELVE FOOT BUNKER IS MADE OF EIGHT AND TWELVE INCH LOGS, NEATLY CHINKED ADOBE STYLE, AND FEATURES A PLANED LUMBER FLOOR AND SMOOTH BOARD CEILING. TWO TWENTY-EIGHT BY THIRTY INCH WINDOWS, SALVAGED FROM AN ABANDONED KOREAN HOME, COMPLEMENT THE MANSION, AND THE FRONT DOOR, ALSO MADE FROM SALVAGE MATERIAL, HAS BEEN LOVINGLY SANDED TO A SMOOTH, PROFESSIONAL APPEARING FINISH.

TOPSIDE THE MEN HAVE THEIR 'SUNDECK' WHERE THEY HAVE PLACED TWO HOME-MADE LAWN CHAIRS. "WE SUN WITH OUR HELMETS ON," SERGEANT ADAIR SAYS. IN THE FRONT OF THE MANSION ARE TWO LARGE FLOWER BOXES IN WHICH STATESIDE SEEDS HAVE BEEN PLANTED. THE FRONT LAWN IS A NEATLY TERRACED BANK WITH STEPS LEADING TO THE MANSION'S FRONT DOOR.

THE COMFORTABLE HOUSE OF SERGEANTS PENDLETON AND ADAIR WAS BUILT DURING THEIR OFF DUTY HOURS. NON-SALVAGABLE SCRAP AND BORROWED TOOLS WERE THE CLAY WITH WHICH THEY WORKED TO BUILD CERTAINLY ONE OF THE NICEST BUNKERS NORTH OF THE 38TH PARALLEL.

### 45th HALTS REDS

THE COMMANDER OF THE 45TH DIVISION SAYS HIS TROOPS HAVE UPSET COMMUNIST PLANS FOR AN OFFENSIVE ON THE WESTERN FRONT, MAJ GEN DAVID RUFFNER SAID; "IF THE 45TH HAD NOT OCCUPIED A GROUP OF FOUR IMPORTANT HILL MASSES WEST OF CHORWON, IT IS A SAFE ASSUMPTION THAT THE ENEMY EVENTUALLY WOULD HAVE ATTACKED."

THE 45TH, AIDED BY THE FILOPINO BATTALION, TOOK THE HILL MASS IN SAVAGE FIGHTING TEN DAYS AGO AND HELD IT AGAINST VICIOUS ENEMY COUNTERATTACKS. THE REDS ATTACKED IN ONE PERIOD WITH TWO REGIMENTS IN THE MOST VICIOUS FIGHTING OF THE YEAR. GENERAL RUFFNER SAYS; "I AM HAPPY AND HUMBLY PROUD TO ANNOUNCE THAT OUR LINES HAVE NOT BEEN PENETRATED AND THAT WE STAND AS SOLIDLY AS WE DID BEFORE THE ENEMY'S ABORTIVE ATTEMPT TO DRIVE US FROM OUR POSITIONS." THE GENERAL WENT ON TO SAY; "THE GALLANTRY OF THE TROOPS WHO BORE THE BRUNT OF THESE ATTACKS, AND THE COOPERATION OF THE MEN WHO SUPPORTED THOSE ON THE LINE ALL DESERVE THE HIGHEST PRAISE."

THE EIGHTH ARMY RESUMED SCREENING OF COMMUNIST PRISONERS OF WAR ON KOJE ISLAND YESTERDAY. AT LEAST 40,000 PRISONERS WILL BE QUESTIONED ON WHETHER THEY WANT TO STAY WHERE THEY ARE OR RETURN TO THEIR HOMELANDS.

AN ANNOUNCEMENT FROM SEOUL SAID THAT THE INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS HAS BEEN INVITED TO BE PRESENT AT THE QUESTIONING DURING THE SEVEN DAYS IT IS EXPECTED TO LAST.

THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF STAFF OF THE EIGHTH ARMY, BRIG GEN CHARLES CHRISTENBERRY, SAYS ANY PRISONER WHO REFUSES TO BE QUESTIONED WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY ASSIGNED TO THE GROUP THAT IS WILLING TO RETURN.

WORLD NEWS

CIO STEEL WORKERS PRESIDENT, PHILLIP MURRAY, SAYS THE GOVERNMENT MAY INVOKE THE TAFT-HARTLEY LAW TO STOP THE STEEL STRIKE, BUT THAT DOESN'T MEAN THE WORKERS WILL RETURN TO THEIR JOBS. MURRAY TOLD A GROUP OF WORKERS IN GARY, INDIANA, THAT CONGRESSMEN FAVORING THE USE OF THE TAFT-HARTLEY LAW ARE TRYING TO DESTROY AMERICAN LABOR UNIONS.

SECRETARY OF STATE DEAN ACHESON IS SCHEDULED TO LEAVE WASHINGTON TODAY FOR EUROPE. HE WILL RECEIVE A DEGREE AT OXFORD UNIVERSITY AND THEN WILL CONFER WITH BRITISH AND FRENCH FOREIGN MINISTERS IN LONDON. THE TALKS ARE EXPECTED TO COVER THE WEST'S RELATIONS WITH RUSSIA, THE GERMAN QUESTION, AND TROUBLE SPOTS LIKE TUNISIA, EGYPT AND IRAN.

ARMISTICE TALKS YESTERDAY LASTED ONLY 25 MINUTES. NO PROGRESS WAS REPORTED. ANOTHER MEETING HAS BEEN SCHEDULED FOR TODAY.
