"MANSION ON THE HILL" NOW STANDS AS A TRIBUTE TO THEIR EF-FORTS, THE FOURTEEN BY TWELVE FOCT BUNKER IS MADE OF EIGHT AND TWELVE INCH LOGS, NEATLY CHINKED ADOBE STYLE, AND FEATURES A PLAN-ED LUMBER FLOOR AND SMOOTH BOARD CEILING. TWO TWENTY-EIGHT -THIRTY INCH WINDOWS, SALVAGED FROM AN ABANDONED KOREAN HOME COMPLEMENT THE MANSION, AND THE FRONT DOOR, ALSO MADE FROM SAL-VAGE MATERIAL, HAS BEEN LOVINGLY SANDED TO A SMOOTH, PROFESSIONAL APPEARING FINISH.

* TOPSIDE THE MEN HAVE THEIR SUNDERK WHERE THEY HAVE PLACED TWO HOME-MADE LAWN CHAIRS. "WE SUN WITH OUR HELMETS ON, SER-GEANT ADAIR SAYS. IN THE FRONT OF THE MANSION ARE TWO LARGE FLOWER BOXES IN WHICH STATESIDE SEEDS HAVE BEEN PLANTED. THE FRONT LAWN IS A NEATLY TERRACED - BANK WITH STEPS LEADING TO THE MANSION'S

FRONT DOOR.

THE COMFORTABLE HOUSE SERGEANTS PENDLETON AND ADAIR WAS BUILT DURING THEIR OFF DUTY HOURS. NON-SALVAGABLE SCRAP AND BORROWED TOOLS WERE THE CLAY WITH WHICH THEY WORKED TO BUILD CERTAINLY ONE OF THE NICEST BUNKERS NORTH OF THE 38TH PARALLEL.

45th HALTS: REDS

SIVE ON THE WESTERN FRONT, MAJ GEN DAVID RUFFNER SAID; " IF THE 45TH HAD NOT OCCUPIED A GROUP OF FOUR PORTANT HILL MASSES WEST OF CHORWON, IT IS A SAFE ASSUMPTION THAT THE ENEMY EVENT

THE 45TH, AIDED BY THE FILO-PINO BATTALION, TOOK THE HILL MASS IN SAVAGE FIGHTING TEN DAYS AGO AND HELD IT AGAINST VICIOUS TEN DAYS . ENEMY COUNTERATTACKS. CIO STEEL WORKERS PRESIDENT,
