

BAN CANS; MICE NOT NICE



THE STEEL STRIKE 1S 24 DAYS OLD AND ABOUT 775,000 WORKERS ARE NOW OFF THEIR JOBS BECAUSE OF IT. STRIKE IS CAUSING MORE LAY-OFFS TO INDUSTRIES ALLIED STEEL.

MAXIM WINS ON 14th ROUND TKO

JOEY MAXIM RETAINED HIS LIGHT HEAVYWEIGHT TITLE BY SCORING A TECHNICAL KNOCKOUT OVER "SUGAR" BAY ROBINSON IN THE FOURTEENTH ROUND OF THEIR BOUT AT YANKEE STA-

DIUM WEDNESDAY NIGHT.

FOR ELEVEN ROUNDS, ROBINSON HAD GIVEN MAXIM A THOROUGH BEAT-ING. BUT THE TERRIFIC HEAT THAT CAUSED THE REFEREE TO BE REPLACED DURING A CHAMPIONSHIP FIGHT FOR THE FIRST TIME IN RING HISTORY, FINALLY CAUGHT UP WITH THE SMALLER ROBINSON. HE WAS UNABLE TO ANSWER THE BELL FOR THE FOURTEENTH ROUND.

IT WAS A DULL FIGHT IN MANY
ROUNDS, THIS BATTLE OF CHAMPIONS
BETWEEN THE 173 MAXIM AND HIS
157 1/2 POUND OPPONENT. BUT THE
END CAME IN TWO DRAMATIC ROUNDS
AS ROBINSON SUCCUMBED TO THE HEAT
AND HIS OPPONENTS WEIGHT ADVAN-

TAGE.

IT WAS THE FIRST TIME IN ROBINSON'S 137 PROFESSIONAL FIGHTS
THAT HE HAD FAILED TO LAST THE DISTANCE, AND IT WAS ONLY HIS THIRD
DEFEAT. MAXIM BATTERED THE SLENDER
ROBINSON ABOUT THE RING IN THE
THIRTEENTH ROUND. HE SHOOK THE
FLOUNDERING MIDDLEWEIGHT KING WITH
LEFT HOOK AFTER LEFT HOOK. AT ONE
POINT MAXIM KNOCKED HIS OPPONENT
HALEWAY THROUGH THE ROPES.

ROBINSON DESPERATELY TRIED FOR A KNOCKOUT-RIGHT AT MAXIM'S HEAD BUT MISSED AND FELL FLAT ON HIS FACE. HE ROSE QUICKLY, BUT HE

LURSHED AROUND THE RING.

WHEN THE BELL RANG TO START THE FOURTEENTH, "SUGAR" RAY LAY SAGGING ON HIS STOOL IN THE COR-NER. MAXIM MENT ACROSS THE RING TO SHAKE HANDS WITH HIM AS THE TECH-NICAL KNOCKOUT ANNOUNCEMENT WAS MADE.
