BAN CANS; MICE NOT NICE

NEWS IN BRIEF

THE STEEL STRIKE IS 24 DAYS OLD AND ABOUT 775,000 WORKERS ARE NOW OFF THEIR JOBS BECAUSE OF IT. THE STRIKE IS CAUSING MORE LAY-OFFS TO INDUSTRIES ALLIED TO STEEL.

YESTERDAY 2,400 CHEVROLET WORKERS WERE LAID OFF IN DETROIT. GENERAL MOTORS WILL FURLOUGH ABOUT 10,000 MORE WORKERS TODAY AND TOMORROW.

THERE IS NO SIGN WHATEVER OF ANY ATTEMPT TO GET NEGOTIATIONS GOING AGAIN. BUT THE FIRST STEEL FOR DEFENSE HAS BEGUN TO TRICKLE OUT OF THE STRIKING MILLS TO DEFENSE PRODUCERS.

THE NAVY HAS TOTALED UP THE SCORE ON THE RAIDS ON KEY NORTH KOREAN POWER PLANTS. LATEST FIGURES SHOW THAT SEVEN OF NINE WERE DESTROYED. THE OTHER TWO WERE LEFT SERIOUSLY DAMAGED AND VIRTUALLY USELESS. NINE TRANSFORMER STATIONS WERE HEAVILY DAMAGED.

MAXIM WINS ON 14th ROUND TKO

JOEY MAXIM RETAINED HIS LIGHT HEAVYWEIGHT TITLE BY SCORING A TECHNICAL KNOCKOUT OVER "SUGAR" RAY ROBINSON IN THE FOURTEENTH ROUND OF THEIR BOUT AT YANKEE STADIUM WEDNESDAY NIGHT.

FOR ELEVEN ROUNDS, ROBINSON HAD GIVEN MAXIM A THOROUGH BEATING. BUT THE TERRIFIC HEAT THAT CAUSED THE REFEREE TO BE REPLACED DURING A CHAMPIONSHIP FIGHT FOR THE FIRST TIME IN RING HISTORY, FINALLY CAUGHT UP WITH THE SMALLER ROBINSON. HE WAS UNABLE TO ANSWER THE BELL FOR THE FOURTEENTH ROUND.

IT WAS A DULL FIGHT IN MANY ROUNDS, THIS BATTLE OF CHAMPIONS BETWEEN THE 173 MAXIM AND HIS 157 1/2 POUND OPPONENT. BUT THE END CAME IN TWO DRAMATIC ROUNDS AS ROBINSON SUCCEMDED TO THE HEAT AND HIS OPPONENTS WEIGHT ADVANTAGE.

IT WAS THE FIRST TIME IN ROBINSON'S 137 PROFESSIONAL FIGHTS THAT HE HAD FAILED TO LAST THE DISTANCE, AND IT WAS ONLY HIS THIRD DEFEAT. MAXIM BATTERED THE SLENDER ROBINSON ABOUT THE RING IN THE THIRTEENTH ROUND. HE SHOOK THE FLOUNDERING MIDDLEWEIGHT KING WITH LEFT HOOK AFTER LEFT HOOK. AT ONE POINT MAXIM KNOCKED HIS OPPONENT HALFWAY THROUGH THE ROPES.

ROBINSON DESPERATELY TRIED FOR A KNOCKOUT-RIGHT AT MAXIM'S HEAD BUT MISSED AND FELL FLAT ON HIS FACE. HE ROSE QUICKLY, BUT HE LURCHED AROUND THE RING.

WHEN THE BELL RANG TO START THE FOURTEENTH, "SUGAR" RAY LAY SAGGING ON HIS STOOL IN THE CORNER. MAXIM WENT ACROSS THE RING TO SHAKE HANDS WITH HIM AS THE TECHNICAL KNOCKOUT ANNOUNCEMENT WAS MADE.



GEORGE KELL AND HOOT EVERS OF THE BOSTON RED SOX SMASHED HOMERS AGAINST THEIR FORMER DETROIT TIGER TEAMMATES AND ROOKIE PITCHER DICK BRODOWSKI WENT THE FULL NINE INNINGS IN HIS FIRST MAJOR LEAGUE START TO GIVE THE BOSOX A 10-3 VICTORY OVER THE LAST PLACE TIGERS. THE VICTORY LIFTED THE RED SOX INTO SECOND PLACE IN THE AMERICAN LEAGUE.
