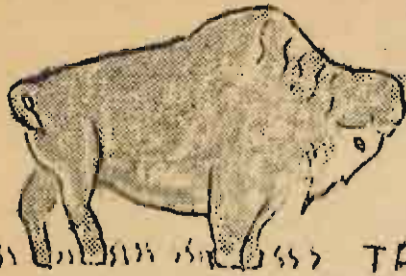

## DIVARTY PARTY ARTY, SCORES RED SAFARI

THE EFFECTIVENESS OF SUPPORTING ARTILLERY WAS EXPLAINED RECENTLY BY A CHINESE PRISONER CAPTURED BY A "LOVE" COMPANY SCREENING PATROL.

A 3RD BATTALION FORWARD OBSERVER SPOTTED EIGHT ENEMY DIGGING TO THE FRONT OF "BUFFALO" POSITIONS. THE OBSERVER CALLED FOR ARTILLERY FIRE AND IN A SHORT TIME THE THUNDEROUS ROAR OF DESTRUCTION WAS HEARD. NO FURTHER SIGN OF DIGGING WAS SPOTTED AND THE INCIDENT WAS FORGOTTEN.

EARLY THE NEXT MORNING, A SEVEN MAN PATROL, LED BY SFC JACK S. ADAMS, SCREENED THE AREA BETWEEN "LOVE" COMPANY AND THE FORWARD OUTPOST FOR MINES AND INFILTRATORS. THE PATROL WAS ABOUT HALF WAY THROUGH THE AREA WHEN SERGEANT ADAMS GLANCED AROUND AND SAW AN ENEMY SOLDIER, WHO IMMEDIATELY THREW UP HIS ARMS.

THE "BUFFALO" SQUAD LEADER TOLD HIS MEN TO SLING ARMS AND CALLED TO THE ENEMY, ENCOURAGING HIM TO SURRENDER. THE CHINESE MOVED SLOWLY ACROSS THE OPEN FIELD WAVING A WORN SURRENDER LEAFLET. WHEN THE COMMUNIST SOLDIER CAME WITHIN SEVERAL YARDS OF THE PATROL, ADAMS GAVE THE ORDER TO LOWER THEIR WEAPONS ON HIM. THE RED BEGAN TO WAVE THE LEAFLET FURIOUSLY.

THE PATROL LEADER BEGAN TO FRISK THE PRISONER IMMEDIATELY. THEY REMOVED FIVE JACKETS, FOUR PAIRS OF PANTS, TWO PAIR OF LONG JOHNS, AND SUMMER UNDERWEAR HE WAS WEARING. THE FRISKING REVEALED NO HIDDEN WEAPONS.

SERGEANT ADAMS BROUGHT THE PRISONER TO THE COMPANY CP AND QUESTIONED HIM WHILE AWAITING FOR FURTHER TRANSPORTATION. THE COMMUNIST BEGAN TO JABBER IN ORIENTAL GIBBERISH, EXPLAINING HOW HE HAD LAY IN WAIT ALL NIGHT FOR THE CHANCE TO SURRENDER.

## NEWS HEADLINES

A MAN WHO TOOK PART IN THE ATTEMPTED ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT TRUMAN HAS BEEN SENTENCED TO DIE IN THE ELECTRIC CHAIR ON AUGUST 1.

A DISTRICT JUDGE PRONOUNCED SENTENCE YESTERDAY ON OSCAR COLLAZO. COLLAZO WAS CONVICTED OF FIRST DEGREE MURDER IN THE DEATH OF A WHITE HOUSE GUARD WHEN HE AND A FELLOW PUERTO RICAN NATIONALIST TRIED TO STORM THE BLAIR HOUSE, WHERE MR. TRUMAN WAS LIVING, IN NOVEMBER, 1950.

ONLY INTERVENTION BY THE OBJECT OF THE ATTEMPTED ASSASSINATION, PRESIDENT TRUMAN HIMSELF, CAN SAVE COLLAZO NOW.

BRITAIN IS SET TO ASK THE UNITED STATES FOR GREATER VOICE IN KOREAN AFFAIRS. THE REQUEST WILL BE MADE TODAY BY BRITISH FOREIGN SECRETARY, ANTHONY EDEN, AT A MEETING WITH SECRETARY OF STATE DEAN ACHESON IN LONDON.

AMERICAN NOVELIST JOHN STEINBECK HAS TANGLED WITH THE OFFICIAL COMMUNIST NEWSPAPER OF ITALY. THE PAPER, A PART OF THE STANDARD COMMUNIST PROPAGANDA ABOUT GERM WARFARE, HAD PRINTED AN OPEN LETTER TO STEINBECK.

THE PAPER ASKED HOW ALL AMERICAN LIBERAL LIKE STEINBECK FELT ABOUT WHAT IT CALLED US GERM WARFARE AND OTHER ALLEDGED ATROCITIES IN KOREA. STEINBECK WROTE A 2500 WORD ANSWER ASKING THEM TO PRINT IT. AS HE EXPECTED, THE RED PAPER CUT AND OTHERWISE TAMPERED WITH HIS LETTER AND PRINTED ITS EDITED VERSION.

STEINBECK SAID ONE OF THE PASSAGES THE PAPER ALTERED FROM HIS LETTER WAS THIS: "THE ONLY GERM THE UN IS DROPPING IN KOREA ARE LITTLE PAMPHLETS. THESE PAPERS CONTAIN THE MOST DANGEROUS AND COMMUNICABLE GERM IN THE WORLD, THE TRUTH. THIS IS THE GERM THE SOVIET FEARS MORE THAN ANY SINGLE THING."

AFTER FURTHER QUESTIONING, THE PRISONER EXPLAINED THAT HE WAS ONE OF EIGHT MEN THAT WERE SIGHTED BY THE 3RD BATTALION OBSERVER. AN ARTILLERY ROUND FROM THE BARRAGE DROPPED IN THE MIDDLE OF THE LABORERS AND ALL WERE KILLED BUT HIM. AS NEAR AS COULD BE DETERMINED, HE DECIDED UPON SURRENDER RATHER THAN SUBJECTING HIMSELF TO FURTHER UN SHELLING.



THE "BUFFALOES" DROPPED THEIR SECOND STRAIGHT GAME TO THE POLAR BEARS THURSDAY, 16-4.

THREE PITCHERS WERE USED BY THE 17TH GIVING UP A TOTAL OF 14 HITS. THE 31ST TOOK ADVANTAGE OF TEN WALKS AND EIGHT HITS IN THE THE FIRST THREE INNINGS TO COLLECT FOURTEEN OF THEIR WALKS.

TALKS RECESSED

UNITED NATIONS ARMISTICE TEAM WALKED OUT ON THE REDS YESTERDAY AND SAID THEY WOULD BE BACK JULY 1. IT WAS THE THIRD RECESS IN LESS THAN A MONTH.

CHIEF ALLIED NEGOTIATOR, GENERAL HARRISON, TOLD NEWSMEN AFTER YESTERDAY'S 51 MINUTE SESSION THAT NORTH KOREA'S GENERAL NAM IL WAS "VERY ANGRY." AND HE GOT THE IMPRESSION "THAT SOME OF THE KOREAN ATTACHE WERE LAUGHING AT GENERAL IL."

GENERAL HARRISON FIRST STARTED TO WALK OUT SHORTLY BEFORE THE MEETING ENDED, BUT NAM IL SAID HE HAD SOMETHING MORE TO SAY. THE UN TEAM SAT DOWN, BUT WHEN IT DEVELOPED THAT NAM REALLY HAD NOTHING NEW TO SAY, GENERAL HARRISON GOT UP AND LEFT THE TEAM.

GROUND ACTION WAS LIGHT AGAIN YESTERDAY. SMALL ENEMY PROBING ATTACKS WERE REPULSED.
