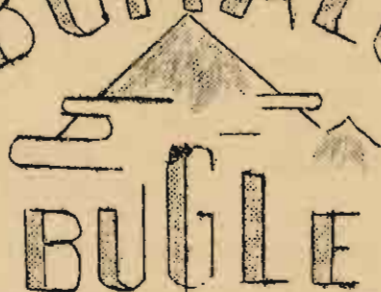
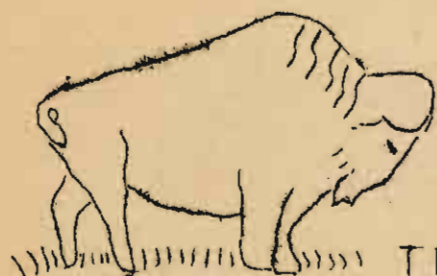

## STEEL AGREEMENT

THERE HAS BEEN A MAJOR BREAK IN THE 25-DAY-OLD STEEL STRIKE. CIO STEEL WORKERS UNION HAS REACHED AGREEMENT WITH THE PITTSBURGH STEEL COMPANY ON A NEW CONTRACT COVERING MORE THAN 10,000 WORKERS. THE NEW CONTRACT GENERALLY FOLLOWS THE RECOMMENDATION BY THE WAGE STABILIZATION BOARD. THE COMPANY IS THE FIRST BASIC PRODUCER TO COME TO TERMS WITH THE UNION.

THE SENATE HAS VOTED TO OVERRIDE THE PRESIDENT'S VETO OF THE MCCARRAN IMMIGRATION BILL. THE SENATE ACTION, IN ADDITION TO A PREVIOUS VOTE BY THE HOUSE, MAKES THE MEASURE A LAW WITHOUT THE PRESIDENT'S SIGNATURE. THE 57-26 VOTE WAS ONE MORE THAN THE NECESSARY TWO-THIRDS MARGIN. THE PRESIDENT OBJECTED TO THE MEASURE BECAUSE HE SAID IT DIDN'T GO FAR ENOUGH IN ELIMINATING IMMIGRATION INEQUALITIES. 25 DEMOCRATS VOTED AGAINST THE PRESIDENT TO OVERRIDE THE VETO.

THE FOREIGN MINISTERS OF FRANCE, THE UNITED STATES, AND BRITAIN HAVE AGREED IN LONDON TO WORK MORE CLOSELY ON MILITARY OPERATIONS IN KOREA. THEY HAVE ALSO AGREED ON THE DRAFT OF A REPLY TO RUSSIA'S NOTE DEMANDING A BIG FOUR MEETING ON A GERMAN PEACE TREATY. THE COMMUNIQUE ISSUED AT THE CLOSE OF THE MEETING DID NOT INDICATE JUST WHAT THE REPLY TO RUSSIA WOULD BE.

THE UNITED STATES HAS ACCUSED THE RUSSIAN'S OF SUPPRESSING THE FREE PRESS IN AUSTRIA. THE US DEPUTY COMMISSIONER IN AUSTRIA, WALTER DOWLING, SAID THE REDS HAVE BANNED 103 NEWSPAPERS IN THEIR ZONE OF THE COUNTRY IN THE LAST SIX MONTHS. DOWLING SAID THE SOVIET ACTION VIOLATES THE FOUR POWER AGREEMENT TO CONSIDER SUCH MATTERS JOINTLY.

## HEADLINE NEWS

TWO TOP ATOMIC ENERGY LEADERS VISITED PRESIDENT TRUMAN AT THE WHITE HOUSE YESTERDAY TO TELL OF "GREAT DEVELOPMENTS."

ONE OF THE CALLERS WAS CHAIRMAN GORDON DEAN OF THE ATOMIC ENERGY COMMISSION. THE OTHER DR. J. ROBERT OPPENHEIMER, CHAIRMAN OF THE GENERAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE ASSISTING THE ATOMIC ENERGY COMMISSION, TOLD REPORTERS "THERE HAVE BEEN SUCH GREAT DEVELOPMENTS IN ATOMIC ENERGY, THAT WE THOUGHT WE SHOULD REPORT ON THESE DIRECTLY TO THE PRESIDENT. WE WISH WE COULD SAY WHAT WAS IN THE REPORT BUT WE CANNOT."

THE ARMY ANNOUNCED YESTERDAY THAT THE COMMANDER OF THE JAPAN LOGISTICAL COMMAND HAS BEEN ASSIGNED TO GENERAL MATTHEW B. RIDGWAY'S EUROPEAN HEADQUARTERS. MAJ GEN WALTER WEIBLE'S NEW DUTIES WILL BE ANNOUNCED BY THE NATO CHIEF. GENERAL WEIBLE HAS BEEN HEAD OF JLC SINCE OCTOBER, 1950.

IN ANOTHER ARMY ANNOUNCEMENT, BRIG GEN HARRY ROPER, ARTILLERY COMMANDER OF THE 7TH INFANTRY DIVISION, WILL JOIN THE OFFICE OF THE ARMY ASSISTANT CHIEF OF STAFF FOR OPERATIONS IN WASHINGTON. GENERAL ROPER HAS BEEN WITH THE 7TH DIVISION AS ARTILLERY CHIEF SINCE SEPTEMBER OF LAST YEAR.

OUTNUMBERED ALLIED TROOPS THREW BACK THE REDS THREE TIMES FRIDAY NIGHT ON THE WESTERN FRONT. UN ARTILLERY AND MORTAR FIRE STOPPED ABOUT 800 REDS FROM DRIVING THE UN INFANTRYMEN OFF AN ADVANCED POSITION WEST OF CHORNON.

ALLIED OFFICERS ESTIMATED THAT FROM 50 TO 75 CHINESE REDS WERE KILLED IN THE THREE ATTACKS.

ARMISTICE TALKS AT PANMUNJOM HAVE BEEN RECESSED UNTIL JULY 1. THE UNITED NATIONS CALLED FOR THE RECESS FRIDAY.
