

## STEEL AGREEMENT

THERE HAS DEEN A MAJOR BREAK STEEL STRIKE. IN THE 25-DAY-OLD STEEL WORKERS UNION CIO HAS REACHED AGREEMENT WITH THE PIT-TSBURGH STEEL COMPANY ON A NEW CONTRACT COVERING MORE THAN 10,000 THE NEW CONTRACT GENERAL-WORKERS. LY FOLLOWS THE RECOMMENDATION THE WAGE STABILIZATION BOARD, THE COMPANY IS THE FIRST BASIC DUCER TO COME TO TERMS WITH THE UN 1 041.

THE SENATE HAS VOTED TO OVERRIDE THE PRESIDENT'S VETO OF THE
MCCARRAN IMMIGRATION BILL. THE
SENATE ACTION, IN ADDITION TO A
PREVIOUS VOTE BY THE HOUSE, MAKES
THE MEASURE A LAW WITHOUT THE
PRESIDENTS SIGNATURE. THE 57-26
VOTE WAS ONE MORE THAN THE NECESSARY TWO-THIRDS MARGIN. THE PRESIDENT OBJECTED TO THE MEASURE BECAUSE HE SAID IT DIDN'T GO FAR
ENOUGH IN ELIMINATING IMMIGRATION
INEQUALITIES. 25 DEMOCRAT: VOTED
AGAINST THE PRESIDENT TO OVERRIDE
THE VETO.

FOREIGN MINISTERS OF THE FRANCE, THE UNITED STATES, BRITAIN HAVE AGREED IN LONDON AND TO MILITARY WORK MORE CLOSELY ON OPERATIONS IN KOREA. THEY HAVE THE DRAFT OF ALSO AGREED MO REPLY TO RUSSIA'S NOTE DEMANDING A BIG FOUR MEETING ON A GERMAN PEACE TREATY. THE COMMUNIQUE ISSUED AT THE CLOSE OF THE MEETING DID NOT INDICATE JUST WHAT THE REPLY TO -RUSSIA WOULD BE.

THE UNITED STATES HAS ACCUSED THE RUSSIAN'S OF SUPPRESSING THE FREE PRESS IN AUSTRIA. THE USDEPUTY COMMISSIONER IN AUSTRIA, WALTER DOWLING, SAID THE REDS HAVE BANNED 103 NEWSPAPERS IN THEIR ZONE OF THE COUNTRY IN THE LAST SIX MONTHS. DOWLING SAID'THE SOVIET ACTION VIOLATES THE FOUR POWER ARREEMENT TO CONSIDER SUCH MATTERS JOINTLY.
