## IN KOREA PLAYING IT COOL

The Communists will get three more days in which to study the Allied truce proposal.

Communist liaison officers, at the last moment, asked for a further three day recess of the armistice talks which had been scheduled to resume Monday morning. The conversations have been postponed until Thursday.

UN forces hurled back attacks by 1,000 Reds on the east-central front yesterday. But an assault was launched against South Korean troops on Capital hill. A smaller attack hit a nearby ROK mainline positions.

The two thrusts were beaten back in two and one-half hours of bloody fighting.

Ben got the nod again this year. "Ration Breakdown called me early in May," he said, "and asked me if I wouldn't be iceman since I already had the experience. So here I am," he grinned.

Private Fleeter says that many men in the regiment are not aware that ice is provided daily for each unit. "Sometimes when I pick up hitch hikers," he said, "they are amazed to see the ice. Naturally I explain that it's made at the 7th QM ice plant and that each company in the regiment receives  $\frac{1}{2}$  pound of ice per man per day."

According to the Buffalo iceman, his cool cargo finds extensive use throughout the regiment. "The majority is used by mess halls to keep food from spoiling or icing drinks," explained Ben. "It's also utilized by 17th Medical Company to keep whole blood fresh over long periods of time."

"I like my job," continued Fleeter, "but there's one thing that bothers me. Icemen in the States meet mostly women while making their daily rounds. A mess sergeant is a poor substitute," he lamented.
