U.S. ACCEPTS TERMS

President kissuhower revealed yesterday that the Reds latest proposal for . Korean truce is acceptable to the U.S. He told South Korea bluntly that the United Nations would not be justified in prolonging the war to force unification of Korea. Mr. Bisanhower urgantly appealed to President Syngman Whee to accept the truce terms.

Meanwhile, President Rhee yesterday throw his full support behind ROK sovernment forces re-

sisting an armistice.
