FIGHTING INCREASES

American troops in the Chorwon sector have driven back a Chinese Red attack on their positions for the second straight day. Meanwhile, Chinese Reds held onto South Korean main line positions in the east-central sector against vicious counter attacks.

Two battalions of Chinese hit the American 3rd Division on the west-central front early this morning under an intense artillery and mortar barrage.

Yesterday morning American defenders drove back another Red attack in the same area.

An American officer said the estimates of Chinese Red casualties for the more than two days of fighting is 500 killed and one thousand wounded.

Heavy fighting continued on the east central front where two regiments of Commies broke into three South Korean main-line positions Wednesday midnight.

CASH AND PASS

Winning jeep and truck drivers in weekly and monthly inspections in the Hq. & Hq. Company of the 17th Infantry "Buffalo" Regiment are rewarded with cash prizes and passes, under a new system started by M/Sgt. Howard R. Dameron, company motor pool sergeant.

The driver of the winning vehicle in each weekly inspection gets a day off; and the driver of the best vehicle in the monthly inspection receives \$50 in cash and a day-long pass. According to Sgt. Dameron, "each of our fifty drivers in the motor pool chips in a dollar toward the prize money, and the judging is done by our mechanics, who compute the gigs received by each vehicle and award the prize on a percentage basis."

He went on, "the purpose of the awards is to encourage the drivers to take good care of their vehicles all the time, not just the day before a big inspection."

In this direction, Sergeant Dameron is starting a week of night classes for both drivers and mechanics, to teach first-echelon maintenance. In his words, "This is not just a refresher course; we want to stress the differences in maintenance of the new vehicles we're getting now and the old ones we have been using." He concluded, "We got 98.1 on our last ordnance inspection; we're hoping to better that on the next one."
