## RHEE BLAMED FOR POW RELEASES—CLARK

Gen. Mark W. Clark said yesterday in a strongly-worded statement on President Rhee's release of anti-Communist war prisoners that the action was a "direct violation" of General Clark's authority as UN Commander.

He said Rhee had broken his promise not to take such action without first consulting General Clark.

"It is now tragically clear," he continued, "that President Rhee has unilaterally abrogated his previous assurances that the mass outbreaks of Korean anti-Communist prisoners of war were not only aided, but actually engineered by officials and troops of the ROK government." General Clark said the UNC has in no way been a party to this completely unauthorized action. "The entire responsibility rests squarely upon President Rhee and the Government of Korea."

More than 600 anti-Communist war prisoners crashed out of four Allied camps Saturday night and Sunday morning, the UN Command reported. South Korean Army tanks and trucks helped in one break-out. Four hundred twenty of the 600 escaped from the camp at Sang Nudai.

## BUFFS TOP DIVARTY, 8-4

The "Buffalo" baseball team staked their hurler, Mervin Hill, to five runs in the top of the first inning, and that was the ball game as the Buffaloes breezed to a second victory over Divarty Saturday afternoon, 8-4. The big ace of the Buffalo moundstaff was in complete control throughout the contest with the exception of the third inning when the Artillery men put together five singles, good for four runs.

A long double into left-center field by Rudy Bunch brought home Domenico and Lozano with the Buffs' first two tallies. John Rodman reached first on an error with Bonanno scoring. Maco "RA" Pensiero reached first on another error as Bunch scored on a wild throw. Rodman scored the fifth Buffalo tally on an over throw of a first base. Hill, the ninth batter in the inning, went down on strikes to end the frame.
