


BUFFALOES TO OBSERVE 141st ANNIVERSARY

RED ATTACK REPULSED

Chinese Reds attacked UN troops with at least two regiments early yesterday on Sniper Ridge and near by Boomerang Ridge. The fighting, some of it hand-to-hand, began at 1 a.m. around Boomerang. Both sides poured in tremendous artillery barrages and the enemy with-drew completely at 4:45 a.m. with more than 700 casualties, an Allied Officer said. Details were scanty on the Sniper Ridge action

The men who will determine UN strategy in the Korean truce crisis are due to gather in Tokyo for a meeting. General Clark, his Diplomatic Advisor, Ambassador Murphy, and U.S. Ambassador to Korea Ellis O. Briggs are already in Tokyo.

Assistant Secretary of State Walter Robertson is flying to Seoul with a secret message from Secretary Dulles addressed to Rhee. Also arriving in Tokyo with Robertson are Army Chief of Staff General Collins, Assistant Secretary of State for Public Affairs Carl McCardle and Kenneth Young Chief of the Northeast Asian desk of the State Department.

Tomorrow, the 17th Infantry "Buffalo" Regiment will celebrate "Organization Day." June 26th will mark the 141st anniversary of the founding of the Buffaloes as a United States Regiment.

On June 26th, 1812, Congress passed a special act which made the "Kentucky Rifles" a part of the U.S. Army, as the 17th Infantry Regiment. Since then, a lot of history has been made by the 17th, and set down in the Buffalo record book.

Among the many activities in observance of "Organization Day" in the Buffalo Regiment tomorrow will be the presentation of awards and decorations, with music by the 7th Division Band. A small combo, composed of members of the band, will stay for later festivities, which will include a buffet supper for NCOs and Officers.

During the afternoon, an Open House will be held at the First Three Grader's Mess at the Regimental C.P. Club. President David Cottrell extends an invitation to all Buffalo and Ex-Buffalo first three graders to drop in between 1500 and 1900 hours and chew the Buffalo cud.

Between 1700 and 1900 hours liquor will be served, and refreshments will also include coffee, beer and cold cuts.

Among the guests will be Colonel William L. Hardick, former Buffalo Commanding Officer.
