## REDs CRACK ROK MLR

Three thousand Chinese Reds penetrated South Korean defenses on the east-central front yester-day while other South Korean soldiers knocked back most of a 10,000 man Red division attacking on the Western front.

The assault, totaling about 13,000 Communists on these two fronts, opened the fourth year of

the Korean War:

A regiment of Chinese Reds fought their way into South Korean front line positions on the east-central front in the same area where about 30,000 Reds pushed back the RCK line a fortnight ago-

The Communist again left American and other foreign units virtually untouched during the night. They consentrated on the ROKs.

The Far Hast Air Forces have issued a summary on air losses, for both sides for the whole war.

Since the Red invasion of South Korea, 950 Communist planes have been destroyed. In the same period, the Allies have lost 973.

The Communist losses include 779 jet planes destroyed in air fighting. The Allied losses include 108 planes of all types lost in air fighting.


In the picture, CaptainThompson is the platoon leader of
